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
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FIRST BAPTIST CHURCH OF TORRANCE



Last week one of the latest typesetting machines made, was installed, giving the operator a wide range of small and large type, from the two large machines. Display lines may now be set on this latest model machine, or type for a lady's calling card may be made new with every order. Old styles in type or worn out faces are a thing of the past in Torrance. The best is none too good, and we can furnish it.

—Nine different faces of type can now be made and used in the regular Job Printing Department of the Herald Office and all of the reading matter and display advertisements will be produced on these machines. —Two typesetting machines, two job printing presses and one cylinder press are a part of the equipment in this modern plant.


