Practical oil men who have examined the hole are convinced that it will show paying production. The oil odor of the sand that is brought from the bottom of the well is different from that of the ordinary oil well, it is asserted, and it will not be surprising if the oil is of a higher grade than any heretofore discovered in the Gulf coast region. The hole was put down by a rotary drill and this fact marks a new epoch in rotary drilling, according to oil men.

SINK TEXAS OIL WELL TO DEPTH OF WHOLE MILE

Orange, Tex., Aug. 11—Development of oil production from a depth of more than a mile in the earth is under way near here by the Gulf Production Company. It is said to be the deepest oil well in the world. While there have been a few deeper test wells than this one, none of them succeeded in striking an oil sand. About twenty-four feet of oil sand were encountered at the bottom of this
