IMPROVEMENTS IN SHOOOL

In the past few weeks many new improvements have been made in the Lomita school, and many more are to follow. The library has been remodeled and several new book cases added. Fences have been repaired and are to be painted soon. Railings have been placed around the flower beds and 120 feet of two-inch pipe has been laid to care for the play grounds and keep down the dust. H. Willard Todd and Miss Irene Mills, teachers, have been appointed directors after school hours. The grounds will be open every afternoon from 3:00 o'clock until 4:30, one of the directors being in charge. Estimates were out for bids on work for the completion of the unfinished basement and the workmen will soon be engaged on this work. The cost will be several thousands of dollars.

Seven new garages are promised and the large hall up stairs is to be finished for a class room at each end. When these improvements are finished, at least a part of the crowded condition in the school will be eliminated.

The Red Cross Nursery class in the Lomita school is progressing nicely. The mothers meet from 1:30 to 3:00 o'clock P. M. and the High School girls from 3:00 o'clock to 4:30 P. M. every Thursday and Friday.

Geist's son-in-law, going over the Ridge route where the scenery offered much diversion for this aged couple. The long ride was tiresome for them but next morning they were up bright and early and enjoyed many trips among the large vineyards. They saw orchards of Olives, almonds, pomegranites and some of the most beautiful scenery in California.
