### FOURTH RED CROSS ROLL CALL

H. G. Anderson of San Pedro is chairman of the Fourth Red Cross Roll Call of this district, Lomita still coming under the jurisdiction of the San Pedro district as an auxiliary.

Mr. Anderson was in Lomita Tuesday and appointed Mrs. S. J. Irwin chairman of the drive for Lomita. Mrs. Irwin took immediate charge of the work and is ready to receive your fee and give receipts for new memberships, dated for the coming fiscal year. There will not be a house to house canvass as heretofore conducted, but each day, beginning Friday, November 12 until Thursday, November 25, someone representing Mrs. Irwin or the new chairman herself will be in the State Bank of Lomita from 10:00 a. m. until 4:00 p. m. to receive the annual membership dues for the American Red Cross. In the past Lomita has always responded wonderfully well and never failed to go over the top, and it is the desire of Mrs. Irwin to repeat the former records. For the first time the Red Cross is asking you to come to them and your duty is, to step up 100 per cent strong and get a year's membership card.
