HIGHER EASTERN MARKET KEEPS SUGAR UP ON COAST

Change in Basic Conditions Postpones Expected Drop—Raws Up 75 Cents

Press Time Note—The New York market is firmer this (Friday) morning, with raws selling 75 cents higher than a week ago and one refiner up 15 cents from the previous basis.

The basic sugar market has stiffened up substantially in the last few days and as a result, it is now believed that there will be no decline on the Pacific Coast for several days perhaps a week. There has been no change, therefore, in local quotations, which continue at \$8.60 for cane and \$7.80 for beet.

Strenuous efforts are being made in Cuba to bring about some means of financing the present crop. Details of the proposed plan are rather indefinite as yet, but it is reported that President Menocal of Cuba is planning to appoint a committee of seven to handle the marketing of the 1920-1921 crop. This plan is also said to involve establishing an embargo upon the export of raw sugar from Cuba in an effort to stabilize prices at higher levels.

Inasmuch as there has been no quotable change in the price of refined sugar on the New York market, a basis of \$6.85 continuing in effect there, the Pacific Coast is technically in a weak position, because of the wide differential now existing between San Francisco and New York prices. Conditions here are somewhat different from those in the east, however, and unless unexpected competitive conditions arise, it is generally believed that there will be no immediate change in this territory.

The Sugar Market has advanced 75c since the publication of the above, making the cost to us \$8.55 for beet and \$8.75 for cane, plus the freight. However, to those of our customers to whom we have advised that the market would go lower, we will sell for Saturday only, at \$8.25 and \$8.45.
