"The China famine is the greatest natural misfortune in the history of the world. Trained investigators, practical men, and a thoroughly experienced woman, have investigated and reported conditions. It developed that 15,000,000 were starving. No less than 45,000,000 are seriously affected.
"Reports, fully authenticated, tell of whole families committing suicide, of whole provinces living on weeds, leaves, roots, bark and grass; children being drowned, girls being sold for \$2.00 each.
"Every report emphasizes the fact that the children suffer the most. "Aside from death by actual starvation, there are beginning dreadful disease epidemics. These will consume weakened bodies like a forest fire burns dry leaves. Then will come the spread of contagion to other parts of the Chinese Empire and eventually to the outside world.

"China's trade is important to the whole world as well as to herself. She cannot remain long in her present condition without the nations, especially America, feeling the effects seriously."

SCIENTIFIC RESEARCH HAS BEEN REWARDED

Ancient Bed of decomposed marine shell lime has been revealed which is not only of great importance from a historical standpoint but is of tremendous value to the industrial activity of Los Angeles and vicinity.
Few people realize that lime is one of the most valuable of all products contributing to the economic progress of the country.
Our Heavenly Father in His supreme wisdom has placed this vast deposit of ancient marine shell lime at the very gates of the center of one of the greatest agricultural districts of the universe. Owing to its easy accessibility this rare deposit is fast becoming one of the out-party show places. Owing to the rarity of such a deposit and the fact that fossiliferous deposits of prehistoric life are occasionally found and are being assembled by sightseers visiting the property.
The Torrance Lime and Fertilizer Company's property consists of 30 acres near Lomita or about five eighths of a mile south of the San Pedro Redondo Boulevard. A paved highway leads directly to the premises.
The plant is electrically operated, receiving its power from the Southern California Edison Co., and is capable of loading 100 tons of 100 mesh decomposed shell lime every eight hour shift.
The origin of this vast deposit of decomposed marine shell lime is due to an accumulation of organic remains or the collection of shell fragments and foraminiferal ooze on the ocean bottom, resulting from a favorable prolific environment during the warm water marine period. The accumulation was probably in shallow estuaries or bays which at one time was bog lime and afterward pushed upward at the time of the break which caused the fault.
Bog lime is a soft calcareous mud and is known as coquina, being composed of loosely cemented shell fragments which contain some littoral sand and foraminiferal ooze.
This vast deposit of ancient marine shell analyzes 96.39 pure in lime.
