A PRAYING COLONEL FOR ALL-AMERICAN



When "Bo" McMillan, quarterback on the little Center College team, started his now historic dash around Harvard's left end to a 6 to 0 victory, the other Saturday, he was sprinting into football's "Hall of Fame" as an All-American back for 1921. Football folks say that one performance, following his great three-year record, marks him as one of the greatest grid men of the age. McMillan is a Texas boy and Center College is a small school located at Danville, Kentucky. Charles Moran, league baseball umpire, is the team's known as the "Praying Colonels," as they kneel in prayer before every game. They lost to Harvard in 1920, their only defeat in four years. 




