ANOTHER BOY SCOUT TROOP

In order to correct wrong impressions regarding the "closed doors" of the Lomita Scout Troop, it was decided Monday night at a short session of the council to organize another Scout Troop to take care of surplus members. The law of the organizations says that each troop shall be limited to thirty-two members, and there are no exceptions to this rule unless special permission is obtained from Scout headquarters. It would take just as much preliminary work to obtain this special dispensation as it would to receive authority to organize another troop. There are fourteen boys now on the list who are eligible and they will form the charter members of Scout Troop No. 2 of Lomita.

Those in charge of Troop No. 1 wish it known that it was not their intention to bar any boy in Lomita from membership, but that they were following the law of the organization, and it was their suggestion that another troop was organized. Mr. C. H. Hatfield will have charge of Troop No. 2. See him for particulars.
