ORDINANCE No. 73... An Ordinance of the City of Torrance Calling a Special Election to Be Held in Said City on the 27th Day of November, 1923, and Providing for Submitting to the Qualified Voters of Said City the Proposition of Incurring Indebtedness for the Acquisition, Construction and Completion of Certain Municipal Improvements.

Whereas, the board of Trustees of the City of Torrance, at a regular meeting held on the 18th day of September, 1923, by a vote of more than two-thirds of its members, duly passed and adopted a resolution determining:

That the public interest and necessity of the City of Torrance demand the acquisition, construction and completion by said City of a certain municipal improvement, to-wit:

1st. The improvement by grading and paving those certain public streets and portions of public streets in the City of Torrance as follows: The grading of Western Avenue for the entire width thereof and the paving of twenty feet of the width thereof from the northern boundary line of the City of Torrance, to El Prado.

2nd. The improvement by constructing a lighting system for the City of Torrance which shall consist of at least four hundred lights placed at intervals along all streets in the City of Torrance north of Plaza del Amo east of Madrid Avenue, West of Border Avenue, and South of Dominguez Street, and along Arlington Avenue, Carson Street, and El Prado outside said district and along Western Avenue from the Northern boundary line of City of Torrance to El Prado.

Whereas, said resolution was duly approved by the executive of said City, to-wit: the President of the Board of Trustees thereof, on the said 18th day of September, 1923, and duly attested and certified to by the City Clerk of said City on the said 18th day of September, 1923.

Now Therefore, the Board of Trustees of the City of Torrance do ordain as follows: Section 1. That the propositions of incurring a bonded debt for the purposes set forth in paragraphs 1st and 2nd of Resolution 143, adopted by the Board of Trustees of the City of Torrance on September 18th, 1923, be submitted to the qualified voters of said City and an election held for that purpose, and that an election shall be held in the City of Torrance, California, on Tuesday, the 27th day of November, 1923, for the purpose of submitting to the qualified electors of said City the propositions of incurring indebtedness and issuing bonds of said City for the said purposes set forth in said resolution above referred to and which said purposes are hereinafter stated.

Section 2. That the objects and purposes for which said indebtedness is proposed to be incurred and bonds issued therefor, and rate of interest of said bonds, are as follows, to-wit: 1st. That the public interest and necessity require and demand the acquisition, construction and completion of a certain municipal improvement to carry out the objects, purposes and powers of the said City of Torrance, to-wit: The improvement by grading and paving those certain public streets and portions of public streets in the City of Torrance as follows: The grading of Western Avenue for the entire width thereof and the paving for twenty (20) feet of the width thereof from the northerly boundary line of the City of Torrance to El Prado.

Section 3. That the estimated cost of said municipal improvement, to-wit: the acquisition, construction and completion of said street work upon and along said streets, is the sum of \$50,000.00; that the said estimated cost of said municipal improvement is and will be too great to be paid out of the ordinary annual income and revenue of said City of Torrance.

Section 4. That the amount of the principal of the indebtedness to be incurred therefor is the sum of \$50,000.00; that the maximum rate of interest to be paid on said indebtedness shall be six per centum (6%) per annum, which rate shall not be exceeded in the issuance of said bonds; that if the proposition for the incurring of said indebtedness for such purpose so submitted at the said election receives the requisite number of votes, to-wit: two-thirds (2-3) of the votes of the qualified electors voting at said election, bonds of said City in the sum of \$50,000.00 shall be issued and sold for the purpose of acquiring, constructing and completing such municipal improvement; that the principal and interest of said bonds shall be payable in lawful money of the United States.

Section 5. That for the purpose of paying the principal and interest of said bonds, the Board of Trustees of the City of Torrance shall at the time of fixing the general tax levy and in the manner of said general tax levy provided, levy and collect annually each year until such bonds are paid, or until there be a sum in the treasury of said City set apart for that purpose to meet all sums coming due for the principal and interest on said bonds, a tax sufficient to pay the annual interest on said bonds, and also such part of the principal thereof as shall become due before the time for fixing the next general tax levy and that such taxes shall be in addition to all other taxes levied for municipal purposes and shall be collected at the time and in the same manner as other municipal taxes are collected and be used for no other purpose than the payment of the said bonds and accruing interest.

Section 6. That the polls for said election at the polling place hereinafter designated shall be opened at six o'clock in the morning of said day of election and shall be kept open continuously thereafter until seven o'clock in the afternoon of said day, when said polls shall be closed and the election officers shall then proceed to canvass the ballots cast at said election for or against said proposition.

Section 7. That the ballot to be used at said election shall contain the following propositions: "PROPOSITIONS SUBMITTED TO VOTE OF ELECTORS Proposition No. 1. Shall the City of Torrance incur a bonded debt of \$50,000.00 for the purpose of acquiring, constructing and completing a certain municipal improvement, to-wit: the improvement by grading and paving those certain public streets and portions of public streets in the City of Torrance as follows: The grading of Western Avenue for the entire width thereof and the paving of twenty feet of the width thereof from the northerly boundary line of the City of Torrance, to El Prado.

Section 8. That the City of Torrance incur a bonded debt of \$75,000.00 for the purpose of acquiring, constructing and completing a certain municipal improvement, to-wit: the improvement by grading and paving those certain public streets and portions of public streets in the City of Torrance as follows: The grading of Western Avenue for the entire width thereof and the paving of twenty feet of the width thereof from the northern boundary line of the City of Torrance, to El Prado.
