## WAY TO SPEAK AT CONVENTION FOR TORRANCE

### Realators' Meeting at Sacramento Will Attract Many Thousands

According to advance information received by the California Real Estate association news department, more than twenty cities will be represented in the thira annual home town contest for the Fred E. Reed silver loving cup at the nineteenth annual state real estate convention in Sacramento October 11.

The following really boards have signified their intention of entering, and their speakers will be: Beverly Hills, W. V. Coar; Monterey, Earle C. Carnahan; Modesto, Frank A. Thompson; Santa Barbara, Earle Ovington; San Diego, Stephen Barnson; Pasadena, Robert A. Swink; Lodi, Harry W. Walsh; Torrance, M. L. May; Martinez, Clarence A. Ricks; Santa Rosa, Senator W. F. Price; Paso Robles, R. J. Williams; Whittier, Grover T. Russell.

Each speaker is limited to five minutes, and three judges named by President Frasier O. Reed of the state association determine the winner. The grading is 50 points for general information in the speech, 20 points for orderly presentation, and 20 points for delivery.

It is expected that more than 1,000 really delegates and their wives will visit Sacramento October 10-12.

A caravan of 150 machines will mobilize at San Fernando on the morning of October 9, under command of Richard D. Davis Jr., general chairman of the Southern California caravan division. It will head direct for Sacramento by way of Bakersfield, Fresno, Modesto and Stockton.

The Santa Clara valley presidential caravan is being mobilized for the morning of October 10 to move by way of Oakland, where all central and bay district boards will hold a luncheon under the auspices of the Oakland Real Estate board at 12, all leaving as a unit for Sacramento. Charles F. Crothers of San Jose, state association treasurer, is generalissimo of the Santa Clara caravan.
