SERIES OF PARAMOUNT FILMS BOOKED AT TORRANCE THEATRE

The Torrance theatre will celebrate national Paramount next week with a series of exceptional photo-plays selected from special listings of Paramount.

The list of features includes Gloria Swanson in "Prodigal Daughters," Jack Holt in "Nobody's Money," Mary Miles Minter in "The Trail of the Lonesome Pine," and Dorothy Dalton in "The Law of the Lawless."

Gloria's Picture

A party is in progress. Present are unshackled females with butterfly souls, debutantes in daring costumes, carmined chorus girls with greedy eyes, foolish flappers fluttering through flames and attended by aged cavaliers and sleek parlor pythons, dancing male toads and two-carat snuggle puppies—and gayest among them all is Swifflie Forbes (Gloria Swanson), the most vivid character in "Prodigal Daughters," a Sam Wood production, which will be on view next Sunday and Monday. "Prodigal Daughters" is a swift-moving story of what happens when young women are permitted to carry latchkeys, keep their own hours, drink, smoke, jazz, and defy every convention revered by the old-fashioned type of women. For Swifflie Forbes, in "Prodigal Daughters," it means the "end of the world" in a manner that will thrill the audience.

"Nobody's Money"

Jack Holt has been proclaimed the most versatile star in motion pictures. Not only has such an honor been accorded Mr. Holt, but he has won it honestly. In his latest six pictures, the Paramount star has played what is believed to be the widest variation of characters ever enacted by one screen actor.

In "The Call of the North" Holt was a fur trapper. In "North of the Rio Grande" he was a cowboy. For "While Satan Sleeps" he assumed the role of a reformed crook who became a minister. His character in "On the High Seas" was that of a steamship stoker. In "Making a Man" he was a man of wealth and influence.

To top these off, Mr. Holt is now starring in a famous stage success, "Nobody's Money," which Paramount has adapted to the screen from William Le Baron's play, and which comes here next Tuesday and Wednesday. If we were to take the cast of Dorothy Dalton's latest Paramount stellar vehicle, "The Law of the Lawless," which will be shown here next Saturday, for an example, the answer would be "Yes." For in this production each featured player, notably Charles de Roche and Theodore Kosloff, is required to do some sort of a stunt before the camera. The star leaps from one rooftop to another. De Roche "bull-dogs" a steer, and Theodore Kosloff engages in a fierce hand-to-hand combat with the powerful de Roche. The minor members of the cast content themselves with some dare-devil horseback riding and perilous climbing of the walls of a burning mosque. "The Law of the Lawless" is packed with thrills, and if you miss it you will fail to see one of the fastest moving and absorbing photo-plays ever seen in Torrance.
