ORDINANCE NO. 64
An Ordinance Fixing the Tax Rate for the Fiscal Year 1923-1924

The Board of Trustees of the City of Torrance do ordain as follows:
Section 1. The Municipal tax upon all property in the City of Torrance to be collected for the fiscal year 1923-1924 as regular annual income for the City of Torrance is hereby fixed at \$.90 per hundred dollars of assessed valuation of all taxable property in said City, and the rate of tax to be collected for the payment of interest and principal on outstanding bonded indebtedness of said City is hereby fixed at \$.08 per \$100.00 of assessed valuation of said property.

Section 2. The City Clerk shall certify to the adoption of this Ordinance and shall cause the same to be published once in the Torrance Herald, and thereupon and thereafter this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect.

ORDINANCE NO. 63

Reclassifying Property

The Board of Trustees of the City of Torrance do ordain as follows:
Section 1. All of Blocks 36, 37, and 38, all of lots 1 to 15 of Block 72, Lots 1 to 13 of Block 73, Lots 1 to 15 of Block 74, and Lots 1 to 4 of Block 86 of Torrance Tract are hereby changed and reclassified from an Industrial District Class VII and Residence District Class II to a Business District of Class V as the same is defined by Ordinance No. 51.

Section 2. All of Lot 14 in Block 19 and Lot 25 in Block 35 of Torrance Tract are hereby changed and reclassified from a Residence District Class I to a Residence District Class II as the same is defined by Ordinance No. 51.

Section 3. The City Clerk shall certify to the adoption of this Ordinance by a majority vote of all the members of the Board of Trustees and its approval by the president of said board, and shall cause same to be published once in the Torrance Herald, a weekly newspaper printed, published and circulated in the City of Torrance, and thereupon and thereafter this ordinance shall be in full force and effect.

At the western line of Manuel Avenue, north curb 78.0 feet, south curb 76.5 feet;

At the angle point in Watson Street, 360 feet northwesterly from the center line of Manuel Avenue, measured along the center line of Watson Street, east curb 87.5 feet, west curb 88.0 feet;

At a point 188 feet northerly from the said last mentioned angle point in Watson Street, measured on the center line of said street, east curb 51.0 feet, west curb 92.3 feet.

All elevations are elevations above the official base of the city of Torrance.

Between any two consecutive points the elevations of which are given the rate of grade shall be uniform.

The City Clerk shall certify to the passage of this ordinance and shall cause the same to be published once in the Torrance Herald and thereupon and thereafter it shall be in full force and effect.
