

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OPEN AIR "GYM" ON U. S. SHIPS HELPS TOURISTS KEEP IN TRIM



"Gym Deck" on S. S. Southern Cross

NEW YORK.—An open air gymnasium on the boat deck of the Southern Cross, of the Munson Line, is proving very popular with tourists. Passengers may exercise there in a dozen different ways as the liner speeds through tropical waters to or from New York and the big East coast ports of South America. Though many ocean liners have indoor gymnasiums, but few of them have exercising apparatus out of doors, where the sun and fresh air aid the tourist in keeping in physical trim.

The aft part of the boat deck of the Southern Cross is the scene of most of the games played aboard the liner. It is equipped with awning stanchions, so that when the sun plays down too hotly it may be pleasantly shaded. Here tennis nets are stretched, with canvas and net back stops to prevent balls from being knocked overboard. Hand ball, with the canvas stop taking the part of a wall, is also played here successfully by enthusiasts at the game. Deck croquet, deck golf and shuffleboard also have their place.

Gymnasium equipment is sufficient to enable tourists to build up strength in many different ways. There are weight exercising machines, "horses," horizontal bars, punching bag and gloves for the boxer.

The deck steward on the Southern Cross is a trained athlete, and when he finds some of his passengers really interested in keeping in good trim while on the liner, arranges training programs for them. Each trip of the Munson liner finds this steward earnestly instructing a class in physical culture. Setting up exercises, work at the weights, on the bars, with the gloves and at the bag all have their part in the course.

These classes are as popular with the women as the men. Attired in sports costumes, the former work as hard at the tasks outlined for them

RESOLUTION OF INTENTION No. 127

RESOLVED, that it is the intention of the Board of Trustees of the City of Torrance to order the following work to be done and improvement made in said City of Torrance, to-wit:

That the roadway of Amapola Avenue from the northern curb line of Carson Street northerly, to the southern line of Dominguez Street, excepting the crossing of Amapola Avenue with Redondo Boulevard, and the southern roadway of Dominguez Street from the western curb line of Cota Avenue westerly to the eastern line of Madrid Avenue, and the roadways of Maricopa Street, formerly 208th Street, Sierra Street, formerly 210th Street, El Dorado Street, formerly 214th Street, and Sonoma Street, formerly 216th Street, each from the western curb line of Cota Avenue westerly to the eastern line of Madrid Avenue, be graded in accordance with the official grade and paved with asphaltic pavement 4 1/2 inches thick, consisting of asphaltic concrete base 3 inches thick and Willite wearing surface 1 1/2 inches thick.

That concrete curb be constructed on the east and west curb lines of Amapola Avenue from a line drawn parallel with the northern line of Maricopa Street, formerly 208th Street, and distant 307 feet northerly therefrom, northerly to

the southern line of Dominguez Street.

That concrete curb be constructed along the southern curb line of Dominguez Street from the western line of Cota Avenue westerly to the eastern line of Madrid Avenue;

That concrete curb be constructed on the north and south curb lines of El Dorado Street, formerly 214th Street, from the western line of Amapola Avenue westerly to the eastern line of Madrid Avenue.

All of said work shall be done in accordance with the plans and specifications contained in Resolution adopting specifications No. 126 now on file in the office of the City Clerk of the City of Torrance.

Attention is hereby directed to the California Willite Road Construction Company's "Willite Plastic Composition License Mixture Agreement," dated June 19, 1923, on file in the office of the City Clerk of the City of Torrance, California.
