TELEPHONE CONDITION CLEARING

The matter of securing direct telephone communication between Torrance and surrounding towns that has been the subject of much criticism, was recently taken up by a committee appointed by the chamber of commerce.

This committee reported last week that it had gone into the matter thoroughly and learned that the State Railway Commission is the determining body in the matter of district boundaries of telephone companies, and that before Torrance was laid out, the boundary between the latter city and Redondo had already been established.

This boundary line runs in a line north and south half a mile inside the Torrance city limits, and as the Redondo telephone company is a local concern, while Torrance is served by the Bell system, and as the two companies are not permitted to overlap in the same territory, it will be impossible for the oil well section and residents of the extreme western section of the city to be adequately served unless the boundary line is changed. This, the committee is attempting to have done.

This condition is also true of Long Beach and San Pedro, but a ray of sunshine has largely dispelled the gloom of the investigators. It was learned that the outside companies are installing many extra trunk lines from these cities to Los Angeles, where the delays occur and when these are completed, communication with San Pedro, Long Beach and Redondo via Los Angeles, will be as quickly accomplished as though a direct line connected these cities with Torrance.

Alleged Moose Organizer In Trouble

L. R. Holcomb, who many Torrance residents will remember with regret, as the alleged organizer of a Moose lodge and who is said to have collected several membership fees of ten dollars each from residents of this city last November, was arrested Tuesday, in Ventura, by Police Officer B. M. Anderson, on a charge of obtaining money on a charge of embezzlement.

The complaint was sworn out by B. L. Phillips of Torrance, who charges that he was one of the victims of the alleged Moose organizer. Shortly after it was discovered that the membership receipts given by Holcomb were worthless, Judge King began a civil suit against Holcomb on behalf of six of the latter's alleged victims and attached the household of Mrs. Holcomb as she was about to leave Torrance. On the filing of the suit Holcomb who had meanwhile left Torrance, reappeared and settled with the six complainants.

It has since then been discovered that there are others in this city who gave up their money to Holcomb in the expectation of being made a member of the Moose order, one among them being Mr. Phillips who a few days ago filed the formal complaint. The date of Holcomb's hearing has not been set. Officer Anderson, who has been on the lookout for Holcomb for several weeks, learned through an acquaintance that the latter was employed in Ventura. A trip to the latter city resulted in the officer finding his man working in a barber shop under an assumed name.

Dairyman Re-Arrested On Bad Check Charge

J. A. Erving, a Carson ranch dairyman, who was arrested September 6, on complaint of Charles E. Whitehead who alleged that Erving had given him a worthless check for \$17, was rearrested September 15 for an alleged similar offense.

The latter complaint was sworn to before Police Judge King by John Botti, of Gardena, who says in the complaint that Erving tendered him a check for \$85.40 in payment of labor performed by Botti on Erving's ranch. Botti later found the check to be worthless and filed the complaint.

When Erving was arraigned before Judge King the latter gave Erving his liberty on the deposit of a \$500 cash bond to appear for a hearing before officers of the District Attorney's office next Monday. The hearing will be held in Torrance.

The Whitehead complaint against the Torrance dairyman was settled out of court with the sanction of Judge King.

TORRANCE SCHOOL NOTES
