Orchestra Leader Visits Torrance

At the request of several Torrance musicians, Prof. J. K. Witzman, director of the famous Naval Reserve Band of Fort McArthur, San Pedro, will visit Torrance for the purpose of conferring with the leaders in the movement to establish a local band.

Prof. Witzman, is probably one of the best known band leaders in Southern California and the reputation of the Naval Reserve Band during the war equalled that, in the estimation of many, of the famous Marine Band of Washington.

Such players as Colonius, the star trumpeteer of Grauman's orchestra, is a protege of Witzman, who before coming to this coast organized and conducted several well known bands in the east. Among these were the Patriarch's Militant Band, the Pennsylvania State Band, which he conducted for two years, the Third Regiment Band of Pennsylvania; of which he was the head for three years and for six years he was the director of the well known Boston and Montana band of Montana. He was also choir master of St. John's church in Philadelphia for twelve years and is said to have a bond and orchestra library of music unexcelled in this country both as to size and value.

Many of the players that he brought to San Pedro during the war for the purpose of organizing the naval band, later made their homes here and a few of this number are working in Torrance and have requested their old leader to organize a band here. During his sojourn he will confer with H. E. Paige and others who have been endeavoring for some time to gather together a company of players. Prof. Witzman is now the head of the San Pedro Conservatory of Music.

G. E. Townsend, defendant. You are hereby directed to appear in an action brought against you by the above named plaintiff in the Justice's Court of Lomita Township, Los Angeles County, State of California, and to answer before the Justice at his office at Lomita, California in said Township, the complaint filed therein, within five days (Exclusive of the day of service) after the service on you of this Summons, if served within the Township in which this action is brought; or, if served out of said Township, but within said County, within ten days, or within twenty days if served elsewhere. And you are hereby notified that unless you so appear and answer said complaint, as above required, said plaintiff, will cause your default to be entered and take judgment for any money or damages demanded in the complaint, as arising upon contract, or will apply to the Court for relief demanded in the complaint, together with the costs of suit.


