ANNUAL MEETING OF FIRST BAPTIST CHURCH

The annual meeting of the First Baptist church of Torrance was held Friday, January 5. The members and friends assembled at the hour of 6 o'clock in Fellowship Hall, where the Women's Society served a splendid supper, the first in the new building.

The meeting for devotion and business convened at 7:45. In the Auditorium. Reports from all departments of activity in connection with the Church were received, and praise and thanksgiving ascended to the Heavenly Father for His blessing on the Church and its work during 1922. The total amount of cash money that passed through the Church for 1922 was well over nine thousand dollars. The Church has been self-supporting for nearly a year, and the treasurer reported cash on hand in the current expense fund with all bills paid. In addition to raising several thousand dollars for the new building and several thousand dollars for current expense, the givings for missions were nine hundred dollars.

The church rejoices in the fact that no recourse was had to bazaars, paid suppers, sales, or any other unscriptural method of raising money.

The following were elected officers for the ensuing year: Treasurer, R. C. Kite; financial secretary, Mrs. A. Anderson; church clerk, Charles Ackley.

A quiet work of grace has been steadily going forward, seventeen members having read the Bible through in the year. Several have signified their intention of following the Lord in the waters of baptism. Three members of the B. Y. P. U. are studying for active work, one at Redlands Baptist University, two at the Bible Institute. The Church confidently enters the year 1923 with the hope that "He which hath begun a good work will perform it until the day of Jesus Christ."—Phil. 1:6.
