ORDINANCE NO. 46
AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 26 OF ORDINANCE NUMBER 10 ENTITLED "AN ORDINANCE REGULATING THE CONSTRUCTION, ALTERING, REPAIRING, AND REMOVING OF BUILDINGS IN THE CITY OF TORRANCE, PROVIDING FOR THE ISSUING OF PERMITS FOR THE SAME, AND FOR THE PROTECTING OF LIFE AND PROPERTY FROM FIRE, AND ALSO PROVIDING FOR THE APPOINTMENT OF A BUILDING INSPECTOR."

The Board of Trustees of the City of Torrance do ordain as follows:

SECTION 1
Section 26 of Ordinance number 10 entitled "An Ordinance regulating the construction, altering, repairing and removing of buildings

in the City of Torrance, providing for issuing of permits for the same, and for the protection of life and property from fire, and also providing for the appointment of a building inspector," is hereby amended to read as follows:

SECTION 26
It shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation, as owner, architect, contractor or otherwise, to erect or cause to be erected, or to commence or proceed with the erection of any building within the limits of Fire District Number One of the City of Torrance unless said building shall conform in all respects to the requirements of this Ordinance for a building of either Class "A," Class "D," or Class "C," as the same are hereinafter more particularly set forth, or to construct a building of either of said classes of a height greater than is hereinafter set forth as the limit of such height, except only that upon application in writing the Board of Trustees of the City of Torrance may by resolution authorize the use of galvanized iron construction for factories in the Industrial district and for barns, sheds, and outbuildings as described in Section 20 hereof.

SECTION 2
The City Clerk shall certify to the passage of this Ordinance by a two-thirds vote of all the members of the Board of Trustees and shall cause the same to be published once in the Torrance Herald, a weekly newspaper printed and published in the City of Torrance, and which is hereby designated for that purpose, and thereupon thereafter this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect.
