

Construction Begun on Dolley-Reeve Bldg.

Work on the Dolley-Reeve buildings on Sartori street adjoining the Masonic Temple was begun Monday morning under the supervision of Mr. Hurum Reeve, who is assuming the role of contractor. The latter will employ skilled help as rapidly as it can be obtained, and hopes to have the buildings erected and ready for occupancy within sixty days.

As described in last week's Herald the buildings will both use the sectional wall, and will have a frontage of sixty feet on Sartori, with a depth of 100 feet. One of the stores will be occupied by Mr. Reeve and the other will be leased by Mr. Dolley.

It is understood that the vacant lot next to the First National bank and the Masonic Temple will be improved by brick building to match the financial institution, that will erect the structure, and that the front of the building will be occupied by the new telegraph office, and the rear by the bank, as a much-needed annex to the bank proper. Just when work will begin on the new building has not been announced.

Scouts Are Faithful On Color Guard Duty

Colors at 8 o'clock in the morning, and retreat at sundown.

Day in and day out, week-day and Sunday, rain or shine.

Such is the routine carried out by the members of the Scout Troops in Torrance in regard to the raising and lowering of the flag at the Memorial Square.

The little chaps perform their duty in a manner which would put many of their elders to shame.

Every morning at 8 o'clock two Scouts appear with the storm flag, which is used every day, and bend it on to the halyards. While one of the boys hauls away at the halyards the other stands at stiff attention, his hand to his hat in respectful salute until the colors are mastheaded and the halyards made fast to the cleat, and then with a snap, the other steps back, brings his hand to the salute, and both let their arms fall to their sides in a strictly military manner.

ONE-HALF OF OIL DISTRICT NOW LEASED

More Than 9000 Acres In Torrance District Now Under Lease

With less than one-half of the acreage lying within an area bounded on the west by Redondo, on the north by a line drawn from the northern boundary of the beach city due east to Harbor boulevard, on the east by the latter thoroughfare, and on the south by Palos Verdes hills, oil companies and syndicates are scurrying around these days at a lively rate in an effort to pick up unleased tracts.

The leases completed so far approximate 9000 acres and daily vacant acreage is being arranged for by the larger companies, the Doehny company, which desires fifteen hundred acres, being a case in point.

Companies are known to be preparing to cross Harbor boulevard on the east, keeping parallel with the Signal Hill field.

The Chandler-Canfield Midway Oil company, with 4000 acres, leads the list of the lease holders, and Union, Standard, Shell and General Petroleum each has about 1000 acres. Among the companies with leases from 1 to 100 acres are the Gilmore Petroleum company, Petroleum Midway, Hub, Fullerton, Amalgamated, G. F. Getty, Great Western Investment company, Sentinel Oil company, Shelby and Root, and Orange County Drilling company.

The majority of these leases follow a southeasterly line from Redondo, passing through Torrance. Apparently, from the drilling done to date, the surface of the field has only been scratched.
