

REMOVAL OF TREES, SHRUBS CONDEMNED

The following resolution adopted by the Torrance Woman's Club, was presented to the city council Tuesday night and was read by the city clerk:

WHEREAS: The Woman's Club of Torrance is concerned over the unnecessary and regrettable removal of the trees and shrubs in El Prado Park, and

WHEREAS: Such hasty action and removal is wholly at variance with the beautiful civic development of streets and parks of this municipality, as planned and laid out at great expense by America's foremost landscape artist, Almstead, and

WHEREAS: This city heretofore cited by all builders and landscape artists as a model, is speedily losing its characteristic features by such hasty action, and

WHEREAS: The Federation of Women's Clubs, with which the Torrance Woman's Club is affiliated, recommend and foster the planting and cultivating of trees and shrubs, and the beautifying of cities, and

WHEREAS: The Woman's Club of Torrance, have as one of their foremost aims, the beautifying of Torrance, in which the planting and cultivation of trees and shrubs is an important factor, and

WHEREAS: The destruction of the trees and shrubs planted in El Prado Park to form an harmonious vista from the school at one end of the park to the station at the opposite end, has come to our notice, and private protest has been without avail, now, therefore be it

RESOLVED: That this removal and destruction of the planting in the El Prado Park was unnecessary, regrettable, and the action of the city trustees in this matter is considered unwise, and not for the best interests of the city of Torrance, and be it further

RESOLVED: That a copy of this resolution be spread of record upon the minutes of this meeting, and a copy sent to the city trustees with the request that no further destruction of trees and shrubs be permitted, anywhere in the city of Torrance.
