TODAY'S RECIPES

Sliced Oranges—Select an orange for each person, pour boiling water over it, let stand a minute, then peel immediately. The boiling water loosens the white pith so that it will come away easily with the orange rind. Slice thinly and arrange on a plate overlapping each other. If desired, a small heap of powdered sugar may be piled in center of plate, or the oranges sprinkled with shredded coconut.

Orange Mint Cocktail—Take three juicy oranges, one tablespoon finely chopped mint, three tablespoons sugar, six maraschino cherries, two tablespoons cherry juice. Remove all skin and pith and divide oranges into sections. Add sugar and maraschino cherry juice and set aside to chill for one hour. Chop mint finely, mix with

oranges, pile high in small glasses and place a cherry on top of each.

Orange Shortcake—Prepare a dough same as for baking-powder biscuits, using twice the amount of shortening. Roll thin, cut into rounds as for biscuits, brush tops with melted shortening, and lay two rounds on top of each other. Bake about fifteen minutes. Remove all skin and pith from fruit, cut into small bits, and let stand well sugared for one hour. Pile oranges thickly between and on top of the shortcakes and serve either with or without whipped cream.

SOME UNUSUAL RECIPES

Pralines—To two cups of powdered sugar add one cup of maple syrup and half a cup of cream. Roll all together until it forms a soft ball when tried in cold water. Remove from fire and beat from three to four minutes until creamy, then add two cups of pecan nuts. Drop in small piles on buttered paper or turn into a buttered pan, cutting in squares with a sharp knife.

Los Angeles Dressing—Beat four egg yolks, add one-fourth of a cupful of olive oil, one tablespoonful of lemon juice, one and one-half tablespoonfuls of vinegar, one teaspoonful each of mustard and salt, a dash of cayenne. Cook in a double boiler, stirring well until the mixture thickens. Chill and add a cupful of heavy cream beaten stiff and one and one-half tablespoonful of grated horseradish.

Hickorynut Cookies—Five cups flour, two cups brown sugar, one cup butter or butter and shortening, one tablespoonful soda, one tablespoonful cream tartar, pinch of salt, one cup hickorynut meats. Work all ingredients like pastry, then beat two eggs and mix with one cup buttermilk or sour milk; add to above mixture, roll thin, cut out and bake.
