



**Lomita Gospel Mission**  
The theme of the sermon in morning worship, given by our evangelist, Mrs. Isham, was "Preparation for Our Lord's Second Coming"; text, Isaiah 40:3—"The voice of him crying in the wilderness, Prepare ye the way of the Lord. Make straight in the desert a highway for our God." Let us prepare ourselves that we may be ready for His coming.  
In the evening worship the theme was "The Son of God"; text, 1 John 3, portion of 8th verse—"For this

purpose the Son of God was manifested, that He might destroy the works of the devil." Jesus is declared in scripture as the Son of God—God clothed upon by a fleshly body, or tabernacle. John said "Behold the Lamb of God" (John 1:29 to 35). In the splendid portrait of our blessed Lord given in Isaiah, 53rd chapter, Jesus is likened to a lamb. Again in Revelation 5:6, God the Father testified that Jesus is His Son. Matt. 3: 16-17, and again in Luke 9-35, Jesus Himself gave the same testimony that

He is God's son. (John 16-27 to 32; Mark 14:61-62; John 17:1 to 6 and 24.) The Holy Spirit, Third Person of the blessed Trinity, also gives the same testimony, as is plainly taught in the thirteenth to eighteenth chapters of John. Peter testifies (Matt. 16:13 to 20); also Thomas (John 20: 24 to 30). In Luke 4:33 to 36, a spirit of an unclean devil cries out with a loud voice "Let us alone, thou Jesus of Nazareth. I know thou art the Holy One of God" (portion of verse 34). Even the legion of devils in the man of Gadara testified to the fact that He is God's Son. A legion in the Bible means a number indefinitely large. In Luke 24:38 to 46 we find Jesus' resurrection body was one of flesh and bones. He was seen after His resurrection by all His apostles and five hundred brethren (1 Cor. 15: 3 to 9); after His ascension, by Stephen (Acts 7:55-56); by Paul (Acts 9); by John (Rev. 1).

All the services were well attended, both morning and evening. Mrs. Isham is a fine speaker and well worth listening to.
