WIFE SAVERS

An owner of a copper washing machine writes that she has seen several hints on how to keep the copper clean, but none on how to keep it bright. She says: "After you have cleaned the copper, cover it with a film of paraffin oil and allow it to remain. Ten cents' worth of oil will last a long time and it can be applied with a cloth. When a machine is used the water is easily wiped off because the oil does not allow it to come into direct contact with the copper. It takes just a minute to wipe this moisture off and apply a new film of oil."

Baked Round Steak.—Cut a pound of steaks in pieces suitable for serving, pound some flour in each piece. Have some fat heated in pan; brown on both sides, season with salt and pepper; add a small amount of hot water and place in oven (with cover on pan). Bake until meat is tender. Bake the potatoes at the same time. When done make a brown gravy and pour over meat.

Heavenly Pie.—Pare and slice rather thick six apples. Make a syrup of a small cup of sugar and one-half cup of water. Simmer apples in this until soft; do not allow them to become mushy. When cold put them into a baked pie crust, cover with whipped cream. Grate one-half cup of American cheese and sprinkle over top of pie.

If you are a flat dweller and have no place for a flower garden you can at least have a window box or two. Instead of devoting this entirely to flowering plants, why not have a few useful herbs growing where you can have them handy for garnishing or flavoring? Parsley, mint, catnip (for the cat), etc., are easily grown, and nasturtium leaves and seeds are spicy and add a nice flavor to the salad.

Cheese Dreams.—Toast six small slices of bread on one side only. Grate one-half pound of cheese (American) and mix with the beaten yolks of two eggs and a little salt until smooth. Spread this on the untoasted side of the bread, add a dash of paprika, then lay two thin slices of bacon on each piece of bread. Place them on the broiler rack under the flame (not too close) until bacon is crisp.

Cheese-Celery Salad.—Fill tender pieces of celery with cream cheese cut in inch lengths. Serve on crisp lettuce with French dressing and paprika.

A good substitute for a small funnel such as is used in filling salt and pepper boxes may be made by utilizing the corner of an envelope and cutting off the tip of the corner.

Creamed Carrots.—Scrape and slice one pound of young carrots. Cook with one cup of water, a little salt, one-half teaspoon sugar and two table-

spoons butter until tender. Add two egg yolks, beaten and diluted in one-half cup cream. Season to taste with salt, pepper and nutmeg and stir over low heat until egg is set.

Toasted Raisin Bread.—Cut raisin bread, either white, graham or entire wheat, into very thin slices. Toast quickly, close to the heat if for plain toast; if to be crisp, place bread some distance from heat and toast slowly on both sides. Spread evenly with butter while hot and serve at once.

YOUR GARDEN
Do not plan a larger garden than you can care for. A small garden well cared for will be worth more than a larger one half cared for. For your lawn commercial fertilizers are better than stable manure, because the latter invariably contains large quantities of weed seeds and will start a fine crop of weeds among the grass.

Bran Cookies.—One cup bran, one cup white flour, one-half cup graham flour, two tablespoons fat, one egg, one cup sugar, one-half cup milk, two teaspoons baking powder, one-half teaspoon salt, one-half cup currants, one-half cup raisins, one-eighth cup citron. Beat thoroughly the fat, sugar, egg and milk. All the dry ingredients and fruit. Drop with a teaspoon on a baking sheet and bake about twenty minutes in a hot oven (400 degrees).

When making noodles, try cutting with sharp scissors. It saves time and patience and makes them very fine.

When making a meat, chicken or deep fruit pie, put a cup in the center upside down before putting the crust on, and the juice will draw up in the cup and keep your crust dry and flaky.

When Straining Fruit Juice.—Before straining the fruit juice through the jelly-bag, dip the bag into boiling water and then wring as dry as possible. This will save the loss of fruit juice sinking into the cloth.
