Auto Registrations In State For 1924 Ahead Of Last Year

SACRAMENTO.—New figures compiled by the division of motor vehicles show a total of 1,121,698 automobiles and trucks have been registered in California since the beginning of the year. This is greatly in excess of the total figures of 1923.

Of the total registrations to date, 970,757 are automobiles, 114,463 are pneumatic-tired trucks, and 36,473 solid-tired trucks. Motorcycle registrations continue to show a steady decrease, the registrations since the first of the year being 9,354. Trailers, however, took a big jump, with a total of 10,100.

The total fees collected by the division on registrations, transfers and licenses amount to \$3,519,807.90. Approximately \$3,000,000 of this amount was derived from the flat fee charged for automobiles.


