**"IN THE GREASE"**

Notes Gleaned While the Oil Editor Bumps Around Proven Territory

The Fullerton Oil company is erecting a large warehouse, administration offices and stockrooms on the Cotton property on the Redondo road (west), which the corporation holds in fee. One well on this property is on production, another ready to bring in, and two more drilling. The operations on the lease indicate that the company will drill up the property rapidly, running three or four strings at a time.

The Standard Oil company deepened Ellinwood No. 1 this week, carrying the hole down from 3625 to 3740 feet. On a production test the well after deepening made considerable water. Whether the water is coming in from the bottom of the hole has not been ascertained. The Ellinwood is the southwestern outpost in the field. It

offsets Chanslor-Canfield's Del Amo No. 12.

E. J. Miley still leads the field with average production per well. Miley's Joughlin lease is making more than 3000 barrels a day from six wells. Operators in this field are watching with considerable interest the experiments being conducted by the Standard Oil company at Baldwin Hills, north of Inglewood. A few weeks ago Standard's No. 1 on the Los Angeles Investment company lease encountered excellent looking oil showings at about 1000 feet. The company now is drilling a shallow well with a pony rig to test the formation.

Weston No. 1, Standard Oil wildcat in West Lomita, was recemented this week at 3520 feet.

**FLOCK OF WELLS DUE TO GO ON PRODUCTION THIS WEEK**

The lull in completions in the oil field will be broken the latter part of the week when a number of new producers in good territory are brought in. The Sentinel Oil company is balling Joughlin No. 7 for production, having drilled to 3829 feet. The Pan American Oil company is balling three wells which should be officially on the list of producers before the end of the week.

The Chanslor-Canfield Midway Oil company is washing Del Amo No. 13 and No. 14 on the southeast corner of the big lease. Torrance Nos. 48 and 49 are standing cemented. They are second tier wells on the Torrance lease. Marble Fee Nos. 9 and 12 of the Standard Oil company are expected on production within a few hours. They are second tier wells on the company's Marble fee property.
