
He revived soon, put out the fire which had caught upon his plank, and carried out fourteen more. Then, burned horribly, he lapsed into unconsciousness.

Loneliest Inhabited Spot Is Found in U. S. Territory

WASHINGTON.—The loneliest inhabited spot in the world has been discovered. It is at Cape Sarichef, on the bleak coast of that great undeveloped empire called Alaska, and the federal government has put a lighthouse on the spot to warn mariners to stay away—not merely from the heart-breaking isolation, however, but because the chilly northern waters hide an ugly reef which waits to tear out the vitals of the occasional unwary ships that invade the loneliness of the remote top of the world.

The only contact maintained between lonely Cape Sarichef and the outside world is the delivery of mail and supplies four times a year.

Mail Four Times a Year

Once in the springtime, once in the summer, once in autumn and once in the cheerless wintertime the several inhabitants of dreary Cape Sarichef snatch from the hands of the boatmen, the mail bag that contains the letters from loved ones at home and the newspapers that tell of months-old happenings in that world that seems as remote as another planet.

Life at Cape Sarichef must be one continual round of pleasurable excitement, indeed.

The veterans of the lighthouse service, whose duty is to illuminate the perilous sea-paths regardless of utter isolation or raging

elements, are used to days and nights such as Cape Sarichef affords, however.

Another lonely spot is Tillamook Rock, on the Oregon coast, where Uncle Sam has also found it desirable to set up a lighthouse. The steep, rugged slopes of Tillamook Rock are so utterly unscalable that it is necessary to raise or lower in a basket the keeper of the light on the rare occasions of his arrivals and departures.

Of course, such an abode has its compensations. The light keeper may rest serene in the knowledge that he is immune from visits of highwaymen, peddlers, bill collectors, and his wife's relatives.

The lighthouse service does all that is possible to lighten the burden of the men who must maintain the life-saving beacons perched on these lonely outposts. The keepers are transferred at frequent intervals. Arrangements are made even to provide traveling teachers for the instruction of their children.

The stations are provided with good libraries and are being equipped with radio outfits.

But even so, how one must miss, at Sarichef and Tillamook, the call of the postman and the grocer's boy, the flicker of the movie, and the chatter of Mrs. Jones to Mrs. Murphy across the backyard fence.

Assessor to Be Here in January To Fix Values

statutory limitations regarding the people's rights.

Mr. Hopkins has promised that a deputy will be assigned to Torrance shortly after January 1 for the purpose of re-valuing and thereby equalizing the assessments in this community. In this regard the deputy will be instructed to meet with the tax committee of the Chamber of Commerce and solicit every co-operation that will work harmoniously toward the end that everyone earnestly desires to see, a fair valuation.

Will Re-Value

The compilation of the data involved in this investigation represents considerable work and time, which it is sincerely felt is far from being in vain. While it did not result in a reduction of the existing tax statement, which is not possible, according to statute, yet the entire district will be covered the first of the year in an adjustment two years earlier than would ordinarily have taken place. Normally the various sections of the county are actually valued about every three years, due to the immense area having to be covered and the limit of the force available for this work.

As the notice originally contained in The Torrance Herald, bringing this matter to the attention of the citizens and property owners, had advised the people not to pay their taxes until the investigating committee could complete their findings, we would further advise that such payments should now be regularly paid.

Torrance is fortunate in having in its midst a man of past experience in matters of this nature, who has been a most willing worker in this investigation. The board of directors of the Chamber of Commerce realized when they chose J. C. Smith as chairman of this committee that they had drafted the services of just that man. We hope that this service may be the beginning of a new era for a broader service department for the benefit of the citizens of Torrance, and the board of directors earnestly solicit the interest and participation of the people as a whole in its affairs, which are your affairs.




