

# WIFE SAVERS

**Nut Waffles with Jelly.**—Beat together one and a half cups of pastry flour, two and a half teaspoons of baking powder, one tablespoonful of powdered sugar, half a teaspoonful of salt and half a cup of finely chopped nut meats. Beat the yolks of two eggs until lemon-colored, blend with one cup of milk and three tablespoonfuls of melted shortening, and combine with the first mixture. Lastly, fold in the stiffly whipped egg whites and bake in hot greased waffle irons. When cooked dust with powdered sugar and serve with any preferred fruit jelly.

**Mutton Chops in Casserole.**—Saute six chops in butter or drippings until delicately brown. Cut into small cubes one carrot, one onion and one turnip. Brown delicately in a little bacon fat. Put vegetables in baking dish, arrange the chops on them, add water or broth to barely cover the chops, and sprinkle with a little salt. Cover tightly and cook gently about two hours.

A very good combination omelet is as follows: Slice onions into a deeply buttered frying pan. Use as many eggs as there are people to serve. Separate yolks from whites. Beat yolks well; add one tablespoon of milk or cream for each egg. Add chopped scraps of cheese or bits of leftover bacon, dried beef or other scraps of meat. Beat whites stiff, fold into yolk mixture, salt and pepper. Put into frying pan over browned onions. When cooked half way through, put into a piping hot oven for a few minutes. The melted cheese sometimes looks like uncooked egg, but do not let this deceive you. This is a deliciously nourishing dish. To use leftover oatmeal, beat one egg to cup of oatmeal; add chopped onions and buttered beans, carrots or peas, whichever you have on hand, put into well buttered baking dish, cover with milk (not evaporated milk). Bake until nicely browned. Try always to have onions on hand and to use them in everything possible, as they are such a very good body-regulating food.

### NUT BREAD

Nut bread makes excellent sandwiches to serve with a cup of tea when a friend comes in to an afternoon call. It is equally good for the school lunch and, served with homemade jam or jelly and a glass of milk, makes a very appetizing and satisfactory noon lunch for children and mother. Here is the recipe for a loaf which will keep moist for some time when wrapped in waxed paper:

One egg, one cup sugar, one and one-half cups milk (or one-half cup of water), one cup nut meats (not too fine), one teaspoon salt, four cups flour, four teaspoons baking powder.

Put in pans and let rise for twenty minutes. Bake in moderate oven forty-five minutes. This makes one large loaf or two small ones.

The cozy nook—may it ever be as popular as it is today. Indications are, however, that it will continue to grow into greater popularity because more and more things are being made which can be used to create more comfort and coziness for cozy nooks, several of which should be in every home. A living room should boast two or three, or more, according to its size; each bedroom ought to have one, and the sun porch one or two.

Of course, a good grouping is the prime requisite of the cozy nook, and in the living room the largest and most important group is the one around the fireplace, if there be a fireplace. Then the smaller groups should be subordinate to but just as attractive as the larger one.

For the living room so small that there is not enough space for a davenport even, coziness has to be achieved with groupings of arm-chairs, one group on one side of the narrow room and the other group on the other side. A big wing chair with a grandfatherly appearance may serve as the nucleus of a charming group. Aided by a little old-fashioned table and a reading lamp with a generously proportioned shade, the effect of coziness is accomplished. A much better reading light is always to be had from a spreading shade than from one of straight cylindrical or narrow oval shape.

A home owner sends in the following suggestion: Use tags freely about your premises. In every home the owner should mark "shutoffs." Use red ink or red pencil to distinguish for gas. A strip of adhesive tape may be put on each meter. A diagram and printed list tacked to the narrow room and the other room in plain sight is essential. Show and explain it to all members of the family or tenants. You will save on the plumber's bill and also possibility of loss through damages by fire or water. In an apartment building be sure and include the number of the apartment, as "water shutoff, Apt. 1." Attach tags to "shutoffs" with fine wire.

**Raw Salad.**—Place a layer of lettuce on a plate, then start a circle with a tablespoon of raw chopped beets, well washed raw spinach, chopped or finely sliced carrots, finely shredded cabbage, sliced celery, a little turnip, either sliced or chopped. Serve with either French dressing or mayonnaise.

**Chocolate Cream Pie.**—One cup sugar, two tablespoons cocoa or two squares chocolate grated, two teaspoons cornstarch, half a teaspoon salt, yolks of two eggs, one cup milk. Mix dry ingredients,

add milk gradually, cook until smooth and thick, add a lump of butter about the size of a walnut or a teaspoon of vanilla flavoring, and pour into a baked crust. Beat up whites of eggs until stiff, sweeten with powdered sugar, spread over top of pie, and brown in oven.

When your cakes fall don't get discouraged and throw them away, but bake them over in this style and you will be more than pleased with the result: Take the fallen cake and crumb it as fine as possible. Add one cup of sour milk to which one teaspoon of soda has been added, one-half teaspoon cloves, nutmeg, cinnamon, and one-half cup raisins. Add enough flour to make rather stiff batter and bake in a loaf or gem pans.

## Here Is Way To Get New License Plates

### Will Marsh Outlines Methods of Applying for Auto Numbers

SACRAMENTO, Jan. 16.—So many conflicting statements have been circulated concerning procedure necessary to make application for 1925 automobile license renewal that Will H. Marsh, chief of the division of motor vehicles, today made the following official announcement:

Branches of the division of motor vehicles located in Los Angeles, San Diego, Fresno, San Francisco, Oakland, and offices of the Automobile Club of Southern California, the California State Automobile Association, and the Orange County Automobile Association, it will be permitted to accept applications from this date.

New license plates will be issued by the branches and clubs upon presentation of the certificates of ownership (the pink) and the certificate of registration (the white). They will also be issued upon presentation of legible certificates of ownership.

**Will Issue Receipt**  
The automobile clubs will be permitted to accept certificates of registration for transmission to the division when it is found impossible to procure certificate of ownership. Marsh advises, however, that every effort will be made by the clubs, according to agreement made with them today, to procure the pink certificate before accepting registration fee under the last named condition.

A receipt will then be issued the applicant. When proper verification has been made in Sacramento of the certificate of registration it will be approved and returned to the club, who will then issue plates.

The clubs operate branch offices in more than fifty California cities, and will have a special staff at each office to handle registrations during the renewal period, which begins Feb. 2. Marsh stated the help of the clubs would assist the division materially in its task of providing licenses for more than 1,300,000 motor vehicles in the state before March 2.

**May Apply by Mail**  
Applications may be made by mail through the Sacramento office. Marsh urges all mail applicants to forward both the pink and the white certificates. By thus co-operating with the department, he said today, thousands of dollars will be saved in verifications and a more prompt service can be rendered the motoring public. Applications may be made by mail to the Sacramento office also on the white certificate when it is impossible to obtain the pink. After verification, plates will be mailed applicant. This procedure, however, will necessarily be slower than when both certificates are presented.

The Sacramento office has already received approximately 200,000 applications, and expects to make delivery of plates on these about Feb. 2.



Section 1. The abandonment and closing up of the northerly eight feet of Redondo Boulevard as shown upon map of Tract No. 4070 filed in the office of the County Recorder, Map Book No. 46, "Page 76.

Section 2. That the exterior boundary of the district of lands in the City of Torrance, Los Angeles County, California, to be benefited by said work or improvement and to be assessed to pay the costs and expenses thereof, are hereby specified and declared to be as follows:

Beginning at a point on the easterly line of said Tract No. 4070, distant 120 feet southerly from the southerly line of Redondo Boulevard and running thence northerly along the easterly line of said Tract and the northerly extension thereof 348 feet, thence at right angles westerly 2880 feet, thence at right angles southerly 348 feet, thence easterly in a straight line to the point of beginning; excepting from the above area the area of any public street or boulevard contained therein.

Section 3. The proceedings for the above mentioned improvement shall be taken under an act approved March 6th, 1889, being entitled "An Act to provide for laying out, opening, extending, widening, straightening, or closing up in whole or in part any street, square, lane, alley, court or place within municipalities, and to condemn and acquire any and all land and property necessary and convenient for that purpose," and under all acts supplementary thereto and amendatory thereof.

Section 4. The Street Superintendent of the City of Torrance is hereby directed to cause a notice of the passage of this Resolution of Intention to be posted in the manner and form required by law, and also to cause a notice similar in substance to be published as required by law in the Torrance Herald, a semi-weekly newspaper published and circulated in the City of Torrance, and hereby designated as the newspaper in which said notice shall be published.

For a more particular description of said improvement, reference is hereby made to said Resolution of Intention No. 210 on file in the office of said City Clerk of said City.
