

War Between Danzig and Poland Seen as Imminent



War between the free city of Danzig and Poland over territory is declared to be imminent by Frenchmen who investigated the situation. They report that Danzig is an arsenal of rifles and machine guns and that the city, with its German population of a third of a million, can arm 60,000 men at the first call. Other nations may be involved in the event of open warfare, inasmuch as Danzig is supposed to be a neutral city under the protection of the League of Nations.

Ford Purchase Plan Popular Records Show

System Puts Automobile Within the Reach of New Thousands

Families of moderate or limited means, who heretofore hesitated about purchasing cars, are coming into the automobile buying field in greater numbers than ever before, if records of the Ford Motor Company's weekly purchase plan may be taken as an indication.

The plan, launched not quite two years ago, was started chiefly to give such people an opportunity to enjoy the benefits and pleasures of motor car transportation, and those taking advantage of it are growing in numbers every day.

Details of the operation of the plan, as just given out by the company, show that from a comparatively few daily enrollments during the first month, the number has steadily risen until now more than seven hundred people are enrolling every day throughout the country, a rather remarkable public endorsement of the plan.

The records also show that there are at present more than 110,000 persons on the weekly purchase plan roll and that more than 165,000 already have received their cars under the plan.

These figures seem to bear out predictions made when the plan was inaugurated, that it would exert a wide influence toward lessening extravagant buying with its consequent embarrassments, and instead afford a practical means for car ownership in which all members of the family can participate.
