Our Public Schools

We put moving pictures in our schools. Now I have no objection to educational films. But when children 6 and 7 years old are made to look at scenes where men are shooting each other, or fighting, or burning down churches, I ask "What kind of education is it?" All of this actually happened in one film shown to the kindergarten and first grade pupils in a school not very far from Torrance. When the movies are continually committing crimes how can you expect them to refrain from practicing what they know so well? The devil smiles on movies of this sort.

A big factor in all our schools now is dancing. It is included under the name of physical culture. But it usually results in physical exposure. Or moral explosion. The condition in our own town is bad enough. Why can't we have a school entertainment by the little children without inviting in a San Pedro dancing school? And the serpent snickers.

Our Private Schools

Now that we have lathered the schools, let us shave the homes, or private schools. The public schools have our children only a few hours—they are at home (some of) the rest of the time.

How the devil must laugh when he sees a home with growing boys and girls where the Bible is not read—or even possessed. Where "Christ" is nothing but a swear-word. Where religion is scoffed at. Where the parents rarely attend church. And never go to Bible school or prayer meeting. Where a boy has never heard his father's voice lifted in prayer to God for him. Where a girl has never heard her mother's voice raised in earnest prayer to God for her daughter.

The devil would find no fault with this kind of training. It is the school of the serpent.

It Is Better

Folks, it is far better to have prayer in the home, than tears and regrets in the courtroom.

It is better to take a son to Sunday school, than to have him taken to the reform school.

It is better to bow reverently at the church altar, than shamefully at the hangman's halter.

NOTICE CALLING FOR BIDS ON FRANCHISE

Notice is hereby given that bids will be opened on April 20, 1925, at eight o'clock P. M., by the Board of Trustees of the City of Torrance, in a regular meeting assembled, for the purchase of a franchise for the laying of pipe lines within the following described boundaries, in the City of Torrance, in pursuance of an application of the Petroleum Midway Company for such franchise filed with the City Clerk of the City of Torrance.

Beginning at the intersection of the easterly line of Cedar Avenue with the northerly line of Redondo Boulevard; thence westerly along the northerly line of Redondo Boulevard and the projection thereof to the City limit; thence southerly along the City limit through all its various courses and curves to its intersection with the northerly side of Plaza del Amo; thence northerly along the northerly side of Plaza del Amo to its intersection with the northerly side of Carson Street; thence westerly along the northerly side of Carson Street to its intersection with the easterly side of Cedar Avenue; thence northerly along the easterly side of Cedar Avenue to the point of beginning.

It is the intention of the Board of Trustees of the City of Torrance to issue such a franchise for a period of forty years to the highest bidder in consideration of the payment of at least One Dollar (\$1.00) per rod to the City of Torrance for each line of pipe laid, as and when the same is laid, and the further payment to the City of Torrance of Two Per Cent. (2%) of the pro rata proportion of income as provided for by the statutes of the State of California.

Said bids must be accompanied by a certified check in the sum of One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) to cover the costs incident to the issuing of such franchise, and a certified check in the sum of Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) as evidence of good faith, which \$500.00 is to be returned upon the completion of the franchise holder of at least one-half of the pipe line to be laid under such franchise.

Checks of all unsuccessful bidders will be returned immediately.

Asks Trustees to Level Plane Field

Charles Vonderahe, chairman of the aviation field committee of the Chamber of Commerce, last night requested the board of trustees to level the field which the Dominguez Land Corporation has donated to the Chamber of Commerce for use as a free flying field. Mr. Vonderahe reported that this field will be shown on aviation maps used by fliers the country over and that it is quite possible to make it a stop for commercial and military planes between San Diego and San Francisco. It is estimated that the cost of leveling the field will be only about \$300. The request was referred to the street committee for investigation and recommendation.
