Public Notice is hereby given that the Board of Trustees of the City of Torrance did, at a regular meeting of said Board of Trustees, held on the 2nd day of March, 1925, pass a Resolution of Intention No. 228, to order the following work to be done and improvement to be made, within said City, to-wit: The abandonment and closing up of the alleys in Tract No. 8572, as shown upon map, recorded in Map Book No. 101, Page 10, in the office of the County Recorder of Los Angeles County, California.

The exterior boundary of the district of lands in the City of Torrance to be benefited by said work or improvement, and to be assessed to pay the costs and expenses thereof, are hereby specified and declared to be as follows:
