



Report Oil Struck Near Paso Robles

Possibilities of a new oil field near Paso Robles is creating unusual excitement up north. San Luis Obispo and San Francisco newspapers carry detailed accounts of the discovery of an oil-bearing stratum by the General Petroleum Company from the Stlayton well at Union.
