
**"Trail Rider" at the Torrance**

**King Players Will Present Famous "Fool"**

Channing Pollock's Great Drama Next Week at Mission Theatre

As the crowning achievement of a big theatrical season, Channing Pollock's great drama of Christianity at odds with human nature in a troublous century, "The Fool," will be presented by the Charles King Players, with Dudley Ayres and Rose Ludwig, at the Mission theatre the week of April 26.

A cast of 40 persons is now being rehearsed in this, the greatest play of the year, and a splendid presentation is promised. Though the play is one of the most expensive of modern productions, prices are not to be advanced. A scramble for tickets is already in progress.

Clergy and laymen, the righteous and unregenerate, have borne testimony of the play and its performance. In the first act the author depicts the upper world of hypocrisy and intolerance. "The Fool" himself is a young rector in a wealthy parish, but his preaching against the preferred classes, and his plea for justice toward those less fortunate, cost him his position.

The second act brings him to the middle world of those who earn their bread by the labor of their hands. Suspected and abused by the very men he would help, "The Fool" cannot aid as a strike mediator because the odds are too much against him. Another act and another descent in the social scale bring him to the world of outcasts, the slums. Here his efforts at settlement work are vio-

lently rejected by some, but are successful nevertheless. At last he finds consolation in his work, and in living in a single room, feeling that he is really a rich man, since he has "peace, friends, time to read and think and dream and help." Briefly this is the story of the most marvelous play of the age. Columns could not convey an adequate idea of its tremendous power to thrill audiences. While preparing for their momentous production of "The Fool" the King Players are giving a pleasing presentation of "The Old Soak," a whimsical, laugh-producing comedy which many critics have pronounced a greater play than "Lightnin'."


