ORDINANCE No. 112

An Ordinance of the City of Torrance Ordering the Abandonment and Closing Up of the Alleys in Tract 8572.

The Board of Trustees of the City of Torrance do ordain as follows:

SECTION 1. WHEREAS, on the 2nd day of March, 1925, in conformity with that certain Act approved March 4th, 1889, being an Act of the Legislature of the State of California, entitled "An Act to provide for the laying out, opening, extending, widening, straightening or closing up in whole or part, any street, square, lane, alley, court or place within municipalities and to condemn or acquire any and all lands and property necessary or convenient for that purpose," and amendments thereto, said Board of Trustees passed a Resolution No. 328, declaring that the public interest and convenience require, and that it was its intention to order certain street work to be done and improvement to be made as therein specified and describing said work and improvements and specifying the exterior boundaries of the district of land to be affected or benefited by said work or improvement, and to be assessed to pay the damages, costs and expenses thereof, and

WHEREAS, in further conformity to said Act and Amendments thereto and said Resolution of the Street Superintendent of said City of Torrance, thereupon caused to be conspicuously posted along the line of said contemplated work or improvement at not more than three hundred feet in distance apart, but not less than three feet in distance, a notice of said Resolution, its date, and, briefly, the work or improvement proposed and referring to said Resolution for further particulars, and did also cause a notice similar in substance to be published four (4) times in a semi-weekly newspaper, to-wit: the Torrance Herald, published and circulated in the City of Torrance, and designated by said Board of Trustees, in said Resolution.

WHEREAS, no objections written or otherwise to said work or improvement or to the extent of the district of land to be affected or benefited by said work or improvement or to be assessed to pay the costs and expenses thereof, were or have been made by any person whatsoever, whether interested or otherwise, within ten days after expiration of the time of publication of said notice or at any time, or have been delivered within such time or at any time to the Clerk of said Board of Trustees, and

WHEREAS, the time prescribed by said Act and Amendments thereto during which objections might be made to said work or improvement has expired, and

WHEREAS, said Board of Trustees, by virtue of the matter and things aforesaid, acquired jurisdiction to order said work to be done and improvement to be made.

NOW, THEREFORE, said Board of Trustees of the City of Torrance do ordain as follows, to-wit:

SECTION 2: That the public interest and convenience require and the said Board of Trustees of the City of Torrance, hereby orders the closing up, vacating and abandoning of the alleys in Tract 8572, as shown on map recorded in Map Book 101, Page 10, in the office of the County Recorder of Los Angeles County, California.

SECTION 3: That the lands herein above described in Section 2 of this ordinance are the lands and all the lands deemed necessary to be closed up, vacated and abandoned for said improvement.

SECTION 4: That the Board of Trustees find that said improvement is for the closing up, vacating and abandonment of the said portions of said Tract as particularly hereinabove described in Section 2 of this ordinance and it appearing to said Board of Trustees, that there are no damages, costs or expenses arising out of said work, therefore no commissioners are appointed to assess benefits or damages for said work or to have general supervision thereof.

SECTION 5: That the City Clerk shall certify to the passage of this ordinance and shall cause the same to be published once in the Torrance Herald, a semi-weekly newspaper published and circulated in said city hereby designated for that purpose of said Board of Trustees of said city.
