(2%) of the pro rata proportion of income as provided for by the statutes of the State of California.

Said bids must be accompanied by a certified check in the sum of One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) to cover the cost incident to the issuing of such franchise, and a certified check in the sum of Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) as evidence of good faith, which \$500.00 is to be returned upon the completion by the franchise holder of at least one-half of the pipe line to be laid under such franchise. RESOLUTION OF INTENTION No. 238

A Resolution of Intention of the Board of Trustees of the City of Torrance, California, Declaring Its Intention to Order the Improvement of Redondo Boulevard between the easterly side of Plaza del Amo and Portions of Other Streets, All in the City of Torrance; Declaring the Said Work and Improvement to Be of More Than Local or Ordinary Public Benefit; Declaring the District to Be Benefited by Said Work and Improvement; and to Be Assessed to Pay the Costs and Expenses Thereof; Determining That Bonds Shall Be Issued to Represent Said Costs and Expenses, and Fixing a Time and Place for Hearing Objections to Said Work and Improvement or to the District to Be Assessed or Both.

The Board of Trustees of the City of Torrance, California, pursuant to the provisions of the "Improvement Act of 1911" and the "Improvement Bond Act of 1915" and acts supplementary thereto and amendatory thereof, do resolve as follows:

SECTION 1. That the public interest and convenience require and that it is the intention of the Board of Trustees of the City of Torrance, State of California, to order the following work to be done and improvement to be made in said City, to-wit:
