### Two C. C. M. O. Teams Will Battle Sunday Afternoon

One of the bloodiest battles ever witnessed on a baseball field will be staged at the C. C. M. O. park next Sunday afternoon when the Chanslor-Cantfield Midway Oil team from Olinda will cross bats with Eddie Copeland's home guards on the local diamond.

The Olinda club has only been organized a short while, but has not met defeat thus far, and has been hurling defiance in the teeth of the local squad until Manager Copeland was on the verge of cancelling one of his major summer league games to take the hand and show them just where they got off. However, fortune favored him, due to the fact that Irvine, the club booked to play here next Sunday, dropped out of the league, so a game between the two company teams was at once arranged, and it goes without saying that this will be one of the most heated scraps ever pulled off on the local field. Excitement is running at fever heat in both camps, and if the attendance comes anywhere near to present expectations it is feared that several thousand additional seats will have to be erected to accommodate the fans who will gather to witness this fracas.

The Olinda hurler is somewhat of a dark horse, having never been seen around the bay district, but owing to the fact that he has won every start made for his club against strong competition, the locals are not expecting an easy time with him. Manager Copeland is saying his star moundman, Cy Williams, for this fray, as he says he cannot afford to take any chances and must show those boys from the "high grass" town just where they belong.

The grandstand has been greatly improved this week by the addition of a top, which will make the local park one of the finest and most commodious in this section of California.

The game will be called at 2:30 sharp.

### TO SAVE WORK

The doors and windows are open so much in the summer that curtains quickly become soiled. Sash or door curtains that fasten in rods at top and bottom look better and save work if they are washed and put on the rods when still damp. They will stretch to fit and will hang much better than if they are ironed.

### WIFE SAVERS

For a simple and quickly made dessert try this: Slice thin four or five bananas and put on them three heaping tablespoons of sugar. Into a glass or cup squeeze one lemon, fill glass with water, and pour on sweetened bananas; liquid must nearly cover bananas. Let stand a half hour before serving, and the flavor will be delicious.

To sew on tating, thread a needle with the thread used for your work (or finer, if you care to) and pass the needle through all the tops of plects. Have thread quite a bit longer than your tating, then whip on same as you tating.

Kromesques.—One cup leftover meat (minced), one tablespoon butter, one tablespoon flour, salt and pepper, one cup milk; pastry, one

egg yolk (beaten), sifted bread crumbs. Make a sauce of the butter, flour and milk. Add meat and season to taste. A little gravy may be added to the mixture. Cut pastry (rolled very thin) into rounds three inches in diameter. Place a spoonful of the mixture on these rounds. Wet the edges with cold water and press together. Dip in yolk of egg diluted with one tablespoon of cold water, then in bread crumbs, and fry in deep fat. Serve very hot.

Caramel Apples.—Pare and core four apples and cut into eighths. Place in a baking dish and sprinkle with the following mixture: Six tablespoons brown sugar, two tablespoons flour, one-quarter teaspoon cinnamon. Place butter on each

apple, pour one-half cup of water around apples, and bake until soft, basting often. Serve with cream.

The oatmeal for breakfast is cooked the evening before and reheated in the morning. Greens are gathered and cleaned one evening and allowed to stand in water until the next evening. When a ham end is used, it is partly cooked the evening before and is finished by cooking with the greens. You can boil the potatoes with the ham and greens, or they may be put in a steamer over the kettle. The oatmeal may be cooked in a double boiler instead of in the oven. The rhubarb sauce should be made rather sweet. Green onions may be served instead of salad.
