ORDINANCE No. 121 An Ordinance Granting to the Shell Company of California a Forty Year Franchise for the Laying and Maintaining of Pipe Lines Along Certain Streets and Alleys in the City of Torrance.

SECTION 1. The Board of Trustees of the City of Torrance hereby grants to the Shell Company of California, a corporation, its successors and assigns, for the term of forty years from the 21st day of May, 1925, subject to all the terms, conditions and limitations hereinafter made and expressed, the franchise, right and privilege to maintain, operate, repair, renew, change the size of and remove certain pipe lines in, along and across certain highways and portions of highways in the City of Torrance, described as follows:

Beginning at a point on Sonoma Street eighteen feet North of the south side of Sonoma Street, and sixteen feet West of the projected east side of Ivy Avenue; thence West along Sonoma Street, parallel to and eighteen feet distant from the South side of Sonoma Street, a distance of 2800 feet to the intersection of Sonoma Street and Madrona Avenue; as shown in red on the map which is a part of the application of the Shell Company of California for franchise dated May 21, 1925, and now on file in the office of the City Clerk of the City of Torrance.

SECTION 2. The rights, privileges and permissions herein granted the said corporation are dependent for their continuance and validity upon the performance by said corporation of all the conditions hereinafter set forth, to-wit:

- 1. That said pipe line shall be laid and maintained at least one (1) foot below the street or alley grade and shall follow a line in said street to be designated by the City Engineer of the City of Torrance.
2. This franchise shall not be construed as permitting the operation of a public utility.
3. It is understood that before any excavating work may be made either in laying or maintaining said pipe line an application will be made to the proper officials of the City of Torrance for permit so to do and in doing any such work the ordinances of the City of Torrance respecting excavations in all the public streets will be fully complied with.
4. The holder of this franchise shall pay into the City Treasury of the City of Torrance the sum of One Dollar (\$1.00) per rod for all pipe line laid hereunder and shall pay Two Per Cent (2%) of gross receipts for use of such pipe lines, as required by the laws of the State of California.
5. The said Shell Company of California shall file with the City Clerk of the City of Torrance within sixty (60) days after the publication of this ordinance a written acceptance of this franchise executed by the proper officials of said corporation after being first duly authorized by the Board of Directors of said corporation in regular meeting assembled.
6. The said Shell Company of California shall within sixty (60) days after the installation of any pipe line hereunder file with the City Engineer a plat or plats showing such pipe lines and which plats shall designate the sizes and location of all such pipe, and all manholes.

SECTION 3. The City Clerk shall certify to the adoption of this ordinance and cause the same to be published once in the Torrance Herald and thereupon and thereafter the same shall be in full force and effect.
