NOTICE OF ANNEXTION ELECTION

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN THAT a special election has been called by the Board of Trustees of the City of Torrance to be held on the 31st day of December, 1925, within the district hereinafter mentioned for the purpose of submitting to the qualified electors of said district the proposition of annexing said district to the City of Torrance.

Beginning at the northwesterly corner of the City of Torrance as of date September 1, 1925, and running thence westerly parallel to the northerly line of Huntington Street as shown on map of Tract No. 3458, as shown in Map Book 37, page 95 of Maps, records of Los Angeles County and Tract 2895, as shown in Map Book 33, page 94, records of Los Angeles County and the westerly extension of the northerly line of Huntington Street to the easterly boundary line of the City of Redondo Beach as said boundary existed September 1, 1925; thence southeasterly along the easterly boundary line of the said City of Redondo Beach as said boundary existed September 1, 1925, and the southerly extension thereof to the point of intersection thereof with the westerly extension of the southerly line of Lots 1 to 8 inclusive of Tract No. 454 as recorded in Map Book 15, page 13, records of Los Angeles County; thence easterly along the said last described line and the easterly extension thereof to the easterly line of Ocean Avenue of said Tract No. 454; thence southerly in a straight line to the southwesterly corner of Lot 15 of said Tract 454; thence easterly along the southerly line of said Lot 9 and the easterly extension thereof to the easterly line of Meadow Park Tract as recorded in Book 15, page 60 Miscellaneous Records of Los Angeles County; thence southerly in a straight line to the southwest corner of Lot 117 of Tract No. 2200 as recorded in Map Book 26, Page 20 records of Los Angeles County; thence easterly along the southerly line of said Lot 117 and the easterly extension thereof to the southeasterly corner of Lot 102 of said Tract 2200, the same being the southwesterly corner of the boundary of the City of Torrance as said boundary existed September 1, 1925; to the point of beginning.

That ACACIA AVENUE, from the north line of Carson Street to a point one hundred thirty-five (135) feet north of the north line of Sierra Street, and

That MARICOPA STREET, from the east line of Cedar Avenue to the east line of Beach Avenue, and

That SIERRA STREET, from the east line of Cedar Avenue to a point one hundred sixty (160) feet east of the east line of Acacia Avenue, and

That portions of REDONDO BOULEVARD, from the east line of Cedar Avenue to the east line of Madrid Avenue, and

That ELDORADO STREET, from the east line of Cedar Avenue to the west line of Madrid Avenue, and

That SONOMA STREET, from the east line of Cedar Avenue to the west line of Madrid Avenue, be graded and that the roadway portions thereof be paved with five (5) inch cement concrete pavement, and

That SIERRA STREET, as hereinabove bounded, be improved by the construction therein of certain sanitary sewers and appurtenances, and

That portions of the ALLEYS or all of the ALLEYS, as shown and that cement concrete walks and curbs be constructed thereon, and

That portions of CARSON STREET, from the west line of Cedar Avenue to the east line of Madrid Avenue, be graded and paved with asphaltic concrete pavement and that cement concrete walks and curbs be constructed thereon, and on the plans therefor, in Blocks 53, 54, 55, 61, 62, 63, 64, 65, 80, 88, 89, 90, 91 and 92 of the Torrance Tract, hereinabove mentioned, be graded and that sanitary sewers, house laterals and all appurtenances for a complete sewer system be constructed in portions of the same. That all the said work or improvement hereinabove mentioned or described, be done at the places, to the extent and in the manner shown on the plans and detailed drawings therefor on file in the Office of the City Engineer of said City, and in accordance with Specifications No. 25, on file in the office of the City Clerk of said City.

All of which plans, detailed drawings and specifications are hereby referred to for a more particular description of the said work or improvement and by reference thereto are hereby made a part hereof.

The grade to which the said proposed work shall be done or said improvement made shall be such as is shown upon the said profiles therefor, and reference is hereby made thereto for a description of such grade.

SECTION 2. That the said proposed work or improvement in the opinion of the said Board of Trustees, is of more than local or ordinary public benefit, and the costs and expenses of said proposed work or improvement are hereby made chargeable upon a district which said district the said Board of Trustees hereby declares to be the district benefited by the said proposed work or improvement, and to be assessed to pay the costs and expenses thereof, which said district is bounded and described as follows, to-wit:

Beginning at a point (180) one hundred fifty feet, at right angles, west of the west line of Cedar Avenue and three hundred (300) feet east of the east line of Carson Street, thence north parallel to the said west line of Cedar Avenue to point of intersection with the westerly production of the south line of Lot 1, Block 87, of the Torrance Tract per Map Book 22, pages 94 and 95, records of Los Angeles County; thence east along the said produced line, said line and the easterly prolongation of same to the southeast corner of Lot 3 of Block 81 of said Tract; thence south in a direct line to the southeast corner of Lot 15 of said Block 81; thence southeasterly in a direct line to the northwest corner of Lot 20, Block 79, of said Tract; thence south along the east line of Acacia Avenue to a point thereon twenty (20) feet south of the northwest corner of Lot 15 of said Block 81; thence east parallel to the north line of said Lot 14 to a point in the east line of Madrid Avenue; thence south along the east line of Madrid Avenue to a point thereon twenty-five (25) feet north of southwest corner of Lot 15 of said Tract; thence east parallel to the north line of said Lot 14 to a point in the east line of said Lot 16; thence south in a direct line to the northeast corner of Lot 12 of said Block 65; thence south to the southeast corner of Lot 15 of said Block 81; thence south in a direct line to the southeast corner of Lot 23, said Block 60; thence west to the southwest corner of said Lot 23; thence south along the east line of Madrid Avenue to the northwest corner of Lot 16, Block 52, of said Tract; thence east to the northeast corner of said Lot 16; thence south to the northeast corner of Lot 12, said Block 52; thence south along the east line of said Lot 12 and the southerly prolongation of same to a point three hundred (300) feet east of the east line of the south line of Carson Street; thence west in a direct line to the point of beginning; excepting from the above district any public street, alley or boulevard included therein.

RESOLUTION OF INTENTION No. 264

CEDAR AVENUE AND PORTIONS OF OTHER STREETS AND ALLEYS

A Resolution of the Board of Trustees of the City of Torrance, California, pursuant to the "Improvement Act of 1911" and the "Improvement Bond Act of 1915," do resolve, declare and determine as follows:

SECTION 1. That the public interest and convenience require and that it is in the intention of the Board of Trustees of the City of Torrance to order the following work to be done and improvement to be made within said City, to-wit:

That CEDAR AVENUE from the north line of Carson Street to the produced south line of the east and west alley in Block 87 of the Torrance Tract per Map Book 22, pages 94 and 95, records of Los Angeles County, be graded at a width of thirty-five feet (35) on each side of the center line thereof, and that the roadway portion thereof be paved with six (6) inch Cement Concrete pavement and that cement concrete curbs and walks be constructed on portions of the same, and that a sanitary sewer be constructed in portions thereof, and

That BECH AVENUE, from the north line of Carson Street to the south line of Maricopa Street, and

any and all persons having any objections to the proposed work or improvement may appear before the said Board of Trustees and show cause why said proposed work or improvement should not be carried out in accordance with this resolution.

SECTION 5. The City Clerk shall cause this Resolution of Intention to be published twice in the Torrance Herald, a weekly newspaper published and circulated in said City and hereby designated for that purpose by the said Board of Trustees of said City.

The Board of Trustees do not deem it advisable that the Clerk mail copies to the owners or the reported owners, and the City Clerk need not mail copies of said notice.

SECTION 6. The Street Superintendent of said City is hereby directed to post notices of Improvement as required by statute. Adopted and approved this 28th day of October, 1925.
