In a scene which is possibly the most spectacular and daring ever made in the history of filmdom Marceline Day took her life in her hands as she dashed down a nar-


row valley ahead of the charging herd of a thousand maddened horses. Her horse tripped, throwing her, while Jack Hoxie dashed forward to rescue her.
