



Q. What points are required for a standard Chinchilla rabbit A. COLOR: To imitate real Chinchilla fur, the undercolor to be blue at base, intermediate portion pearl gray, merging into white and slightly tipped with black; the whole of the body fur, from nap to flanks, interspersed with longer hair of jet black; both even and wavy ticking admissible; neck fur very much lighter in color than body, but this is strictly confined to the nap; the flanks and chest to be ticked of a uniform shade of pearl gray; but of a slightly lighter shade than the body; the eye circles to be light pearl gray, distinct and well defined; the under parts of body to be white, with undercolor slate blue; the tail to be ticked and slightly darker than body on upper side, white on under side and the whole carried in a straight line with the body.
