Q. Are Rabbit furs used generally in America?
A. Yes, to an almost unbelievable extent. America imported from Europe, Great Britain, China, Japan, Australia, and New Zealand, in 1924, over 100,000,000 undressed rabbit, hare and coney (European rabbit) skins valued at about \$19,000,000 in addition to other dressed and dyed rabbit furs. We estimate that some 30,000,000 were used by the fur trade; the balance by the hat manufacturing trade. Rabbit furs have increased in value about 1000 per cent in the last ten years, and more and more are used every year.

James T. Wise, aged 66, substantial property owner of Torrance, died Wednesday afternoon at the Stiney Torrance Memorial Hospital as the result of burns received last week when he fell into a vat of hot acid solution at the Torrance Flat Glass Company's plant.

Mr. Wise's death followed that of Mrs. Wise by several weeks. A daughter, Mrs. O. W. Hudson, of Andree avenue, survives.

An inquest will be held Saturday morning. The funeral will be at 2:30 Saturday afternoon at the Central Evangelical Church.
