
FIVE HUNDRED DINNER CLUB IS ENTERTAINED

ORDINANCE No. 135

An Ordinance of the City of Torrance Amending Ordinance No. 133.

The Board of Trustees of the City of Torrance do ordain as follows:

SECTION 1. Ordinance No. 133 of the City of Torrance is hereby amended by striking from Section 3 that portion thereof reading as follows, "City Marshall \$300.00," and substituting therefor the words as follows, "City Marshall \$225.00."

SECTION 2. The City Clerk shall certify to the passage of this ordinance and shall cause the same to be published once in the Torrance Herald, a weekly newspaper of general circulation published and circulated in the said City of Torrance, and thereupon and thereafter this ordinance shall be in full force and effect.
