## So. Cal. Air Mail System Sets Record

On July 16 "Western Air Express, Inc., completed its first three months of flying the air mail to and from Southern California with a record both in operation and business not approached by any other of the twelve contract air mail routes serving various sections of the country. During the period it is estimated that mailers of Southern California dispatched nearly 750,000 letters by air mail, in the dispatch of which from one to three days was saved on each piece. The letter-day saving thus effected to the benefit of Southern California business is computed at in excess of two million.

Operation of the line has been near-perfect, the planes flying each way daily without default, mishap or serious delay.

Since May 23 the passenger service of the line has been a daily accommodation of which business men and tourists have availed themselves for the quick passage over the desert. All mail planes operated by Western Air Express, Inc., depart Los Angeles daily at 7:35 a. m. and arrive daily at 5:25 p. m.

Economic advantages of air mail and aerial passenger travel over the slower train haul, combined with the excellent performance of the local line, have resulted in a steadily growing use of this service and has placed Southern California in the lead of American communities as a center of commercial aviation, it is said.






