Work of Local Chamber Shown In New Report

has been manifested and we hope that this autumn may be a definite proof of service, not only to the prospective employees, but to the industries as well.

A definite labor market is one of the important advantages in an industrial community and it is earnestly hoped that this medium may develop this attribute in Torrance to a still greater degree.

Economics at Home
The above caption does not refer to home economics in a domestic sense, but deals with the economic relationship between the consumption of materials produced in the local industries.

In this particular connection we feel that the attention of every local contractor should be called to the quality of glass now being produced by the Torrance Flat Glass plant. Substantial pride should obtain in this community for the possession of this magnificent industry.

Very able management of Mr. Coates is getting onto a production basis that is demonstrating very good satisfaction.

In order to make a campaign of definite effect in the support of this industry, everyone contemplating building in Torrance should specify Torrance glass. On the individual unit this item might be thought to be comparatively small, but the aggregate will be considerable and the manifestation of the local booster spirit in the matter alone is one of principle which should be practiced.

Pass this to your friend who may be building.

Bulletin Service
Through information obtained from good friend Richard R. Smith, this bureau is now included on the mailing list for the petroleum statistics issued by the Petroleum Institute. These bulletins contain considerable information regarding the various activities in connection with the oil development of the Pacific coast region and are available for the information of anyone desiring such data.

Interchange Question
This subject is one of which you have, of course, heard much of late. During the past few weeks considerable concentrated activity has been directed to this matter. A map has been prepared showing the existing lines of both carriers and all present industries. It also depicts the proposed development of the Santa Fe and is accompanied by a petition signed by the executives of the industries, the Board of Trustees, the banks, and other commercial users.

The need for this physical arrangement is so evident that it is firmly believed the carriers will treat the matter favorably, resulting in prompt installation of the necessary trackage connections.

With the consummation of this matter Torrance will have added to its list of attributes a very important factor in attracting new industries.

Publicity and Promotional Activities
Through the co-operation of the Los Angeles Chamber of Commerce, who are conducting the Los Angeles County Exhibit at the Sesqui-centennial Exposition in Philadelphia, a 24x35-foot colored transparency showing the view of El Prado street, looking toward the high school from Cravens avenue, is on exhibition at this exposition.

Several thousand copies of Torrance literature have also been directed through this channel, and from reports received is a popular folder among those being distributed.

At the Chicago headquarters of the Los Angeles Chamber of Commerce a supply of Torrance literature is also maintained. The consumption at this point alone is approximately 500 booklets a month. Direct mailing lists are also received twice monthly from the Chicago headquarters, showing very substantial lists of direct inquiries at that office.

The Harbor District News, which is the official organ of the Harbor District Chambers of Commerce, has also been a medium which this bureau has used quite extensively by obtaining stories on the development and activities of special news value regarding Torrance. During the past three months over 100 inches of publicity, in addition to illustrations, has been obtained. The circulation of this regional newsletter is now about 10,000 monthly.

Several personal inquiries have come to the attention of your Chamber of Commerce as a result of this publicity.

Co-operative Efforts
Recently this chamber has been solicited by residents in the Keystone and Shoestring areas for assistance in obtaining improvements and needs which are manifest in those sections. To this end the interest of Mr. C. J. Colden, councilman of the Fifteenth district, in which the Shoestring strip lies, was obtained, resulting in a meeting being held in Torrance two weeks ago, at which time the directors of this chamber presented the matters referred to.

This, of course, is outside of the corporate area of this community but is logically within the trading radius of Torrance, and it is gratifying that the people in that section feel a kindness toward this community which has prompted their expression for civic assistance. We feel that the merchants of Torrance would do well to follow this contact of friendliness as a means of insuring their good will from a commercial aspect. Much good many times obtains as the
