County President Will Be Present at Garden Ceremony

A garden service, which will be totally different from the usual evening services of the Community Presbyterian Church, will be put on by the Intermediate Christian Endeavor Society Sunday evening at 7:15 o'clock.

The usual pulpit furniture will be removed for the occasion and in its place will be seen a beautiful California summer garden. A corps of workers under the direction of Marguerite McCartney, social director of the local society, will attend to the mechanical perfection of the stage. Flowers will abound everywhere, and live trees will hide the bare walls behind, and in the foreground will be seated the entire membership of the society. Special lighting effects have been obtained, and no time or money has been spared in making this service the best of all the year.

Here is Program

The order of events will be as follows: At 7:15 the six-piece Christian Endeavor orchestra will give a 15-minute recital under the direction of Effie Eade. This will be composed of popular and sacred numbers. The kind of a song service that isn't forgotten is promised at 7:30, which will be accompanied by the C. E. choir, composed of the entire membership of the society. Special singing arrangements have been made. There will be a quartet as well as duet numbers, and Katherine Hunter will sing "My Task."

The welcoming of new members received since August 1 and also the ceremonies given to the 50th anniversary of the society will be conducted by John Stanton, acting president and presiding officer of the evening. Alice Rugraff will read the scripture lesson. The installation ceremonies for the new executive will be carried out by Mr. and Mrs. W. E. Bowen of Torrance, the new Los Angeles County president, and the Redondo district president, respectively.

Graham Tinning will give the address of the evening, speaking on "What We Want." Another short talk will be given by one of the members on "The What and Why of C. E." Miss Laura E. Thomas, superintendent, will lead in prayer. This is the first service of its kind ever held in Lomita, and the Endeavorers promise that it will be one long to be remembered. A large crowd is expected, and many outside guests are expected also.
