Death Claims Martha Acree At Age of 75

Well Known Torrance Woman Dies After Years of Illness

Mrs. Martha L. Acree, 75, passed away Saturday, Dec. 11, at the home of her son, Lambert J. Acree, of 1747 Gramercy avenue.

A semi-invalid since 1917, Mrs. Acree was seized with a sudden illness three months ago while visiting a daughter at Artesia, N. M., but recovered sufficiently to return to Torrance.

Born in Indiana, Mrs. Acree was married in 1861 to John B. Acree, who died in June, 1921, one year after coming to make their home with their daughter, Mrs. E. N. Tomkins. The Tomkins then lived at Cypress street and Redondo boulevard, Lomita.

Mrs. Acree, formerly a member of the Lomita Community Church, was a member of the Ladies' Aid Society of the Methodist Church of Torrance.

Surviving Mrs. Acree are five daughters—Mrs. R. B. Roll of Santa Clara, Mrs. C. F. Doyle of Sacramento, Mrs. C. J. Dexter of Artesia, N. M., Mrs. W. R. Downer of Glendale, and Mrs. E. N. Tomkins; a son, Lambert J. Acree; 12 grandchildren and three great-grandchildren; two brothers and one sister in Indiana, a brother in Kansas, and a nephew, Ralph Clever, of Fullerton. One daughter, Mrs. Belle Wimmer, died in 1906, and one son, Charles Acree, passed away in 1909.

Funeral services were conducted at Stone and Myers' chapel Monday by Rev. Alex Lyall. Interment was made at Mountain View, Pasadena.

Said bids must specify at what price per gallon the bidder will furnish not less than 5000 gallons of gasoline during said period delivered into tanks at Torrance Fire Station in such quantities as may be ordered from time to time, delivery to be made within twenty-four hours after being ordered, no single delivery to exceed 500 gallons. Such gasoline shall conform in quality to the United States Navy Standard.

Such bids shall further provide for furnishing such gasoline at the market price of such gasoline, if at any time during such period such market price shall be less than the contract price.
