Torrance scouts are passing tests and advancing in rank. The test passing record up to and including Monday of this week is as follows: Troop No. 1 thirty-six, Troop No. 3 seventeen and Troop No. 4 thirty-three. The total of eighty-six is the record for any town in the Harbor District for the month of January. During the month there have been nine advancements in rank, four to second class and five to first class. This is also the record for any town in the District.

Ten scouts from Troops 1 and 4 spent Saturday and Sunday at the District Week-End camp at Portuguese Harbor enjoying the camp facilities. Wilson Page, Troop 4, passed the first class swimming test, by swimming the regulation 150 feet in the ocean outside the breakwater line, emulating his father, one of the channel contestants, by having the camp boat accompany him on his swim.

the scout swimming night on Monday evening at the Anderson plunge in San Pedro when classes for beginners, advanced swimmers and life saving are conducted. Two local scouts, Richard Pullman and Albert Bartlett, are in the life saving class.

Torrance scouts will conduct a rally on Friday evening of this week in the auditorium of the Torrance Elementary school to which the public is cordially invited. Parents of local scouts are urged to be present as one of the contests is based on the greatest percentage of parents present as representing any one troop. Other contests include signalling, friction fire and an essay contest on the subject of "Why I Believe In Scouting."

The membership of Troop 4 is closed, but Troops 1 and 3 are open to applications from boys interested in becoming scouts. Troop 3 is made up largely of older scouts. The meeting nights are as follows: Troop 1 Wednesday, Troop 4 Thursday and Troop 3 Friday. All meetings are held in the scout building on Carson Street west of the American Legion building.

As the result of an inter-patrol contest in Troop No. 4 the Panther Patrol, Francis Deane, Patrol leader, will enjoy an overnight camp at the Boys' Camp in Griffith Park next Saturday and Sunday. The District Commissioner will be in charge of the party.
