North Country Depicted In Stirring Films

Dog Stars Are Featured In Thrilling Tale of Love and Action.

Romance plays an important role in Fox Films version of "Wings of the Storm," J. G. Blystone's production coming to the Torrance Theater Sunday and Monday. In fact, there is a double romance. Thunder, the marvelous police dog star, and White Fawn, a pure white police dog, figure in one and Virginia Brown Faire, the "Tinker Bell Girl" of "Peter Pan" fame, and Reed Howes, noted western actor, are the central figures in the other. "Wings of the Storm" is declared by critics to be the greatest dog story ever filmed. Olive Borden, dark-eyed Virginia girl, star of Fox Films version of "The Country Beyond," by James Oliver Curwood, coming Saturday to the Torrance Theater, is a fascinating personality in the role of Valencia, French-Canadian girl of the northland's primitive forests. In the earlier scenes, where she appears in old-fashioned garments, she is a quaint little figure with a native talent for dancing. Later on one sees her in the spotlight of a music box revue. Pictorial embellishments, alone, are declared to be well worth one's time in viewing this film. 




