Hospital Association Re-Elects Three Directors and Officers

All directors and officers whose terms expired were re-elected last night at the annual meeting of the Torrance Hospital Association.

The following officers were re-elected: Dr. J. S. Lancaster, George W. Neill, W. Harold Kingsley.

The financial statement for the year was read at the meeting and revealed that the institution operated at a loss last year, income being \$50,548.55, as against expenses of \$52,395.74.

The statement reveals that the difference between income and expenses would have been extremely large had it not been for the endowment. Receipts from the endowment for the year were \$7320.

\$4746.50 for depreciation. The charitable work done by the institution during the year aggregated \$2762.87.

A total of 1079 patients were treated during the year. Of this number 136 were discharged after temporary dressings or treatments and 52 were in for X-ray pictures and laboratory tests, while 891 were admitted. Of these 856 were discharged, 35 died, and 25 were in the hospital on December 31, 1926.

There were 286 minor operations, 164 major operations, and 141 obstetric cases. Of these latter 120 were Caesarian births, 120 normal births, and 6 still births.

The daily average number of patients was 22, while there were 7795 actual patient days. (A patient day is one patient for one day.)
