Wife Savers

Sandwiches
The sandwich is always popular, and makes an important part of many a meal. The following may be used for various occasions—Sunday night lunches, picnics, or evening suppers:

Bermuda Onion Sandwiches.—Spread thin slices of white bread with mayonnaise dressing. Cover

half the slices with thinly sliced onion, sprinkle with salt and pepper. Dip crisp lettuce into French dressing and lay on the onion; cover with the remaining slices of bread. Press edges, trim off the crust and edges with triangles and sprinkle lightly with minced parsley.

Deviled Sandwiches.—Toast delicately two-thirds cupful of finely shredded almonds in just enough butter to prevent burning, stirring constantly. Chop fine. Mix two tablespoonfuls of finely chopped olives, one tablespoonful of finely chopped sweet pickles, one tablespoonful of chutney, one teaspoonful of Worcestershire sauce, one-fourth teaspoonful of salt, and a few grains of cayenne; add warm roast beef through the meat chopper twice, using a fine cutting

knife for the second grinding. Season with salt and pepper, celery salt, tomato catsup, Worcestershire sauce, and grated horseradish; moisten with mayonnaise. Use as a filling with mustard butter. (Copyright, 1927, Western Npr. Union)

Egg, Ham and Watercress.—Mash and rub the yolks of hard-boiled eggs through a sieve; finely chop the whites of the eggs. Add half the quantity of finely minced, lean, cooked ham, one cupful of finely chopped watercress, season with salt, cayenne, and moisten with salad dressing. Use as filling on slices of rye bread that have been spread with mustard butter. Serve with coffee.

Roast Beef Sandwiches.—Pass rare roast beef through the meat chopper twice, using a fine cutting
