'Human' Phonograph Attracts Interest At Wurlitzer Store

A phonograph with decidedly human attributes has been attracting street crowds in front of Harold Rasmussen's Wurlitzer store at 1228 El Prado.

The machine, left entirely to itself, plays an hour's program of selected music from a dozen records. It changes its own records with less break in the continuity of the music than is necessitated by human operation of the machine.

The new phonograph, designed to do away with the annoyance of continual record changing during long musical programs, allows the selection of a dozen records at a time, to be played in order. The records are placed in a magazine and the mechanism does the rest.

Lindbergh Photos Sent Across Ocean With Amazing Speed

Although Capt. Charles Lindbergh established time and distance aviation records in his open air trip to Paris, faster even than his flight were pictures of his landing in the French capital flashed back to the United States by cable, and then sent across the continent by Bell Telephone.

Lindbergh arrived in Paris after 10 p.m. May 21, yet the next day a Los Angeles newspaper was in possession of copies of the picture of the actual demonstration that took place on Le Bourget field after the American flyer landed. By a special transmission system known as the Bartane process the pictures were cabled under the Atlantic, and as soon as reproduced were wired to Los Angeles by Telephoto. It is estimated that the entire time of transmission from France to Los Angeles did not exceed two hours.

Wife Savers

SPECIAL GOOD THINGS

Fortunately we are not all alike in our tastes. Food of which one is especially fond will not be at all acceptable to his neighbor. This diversity of tastes gives us many dishes, and he is indeed hard to suit who is not able to find some to his liking.

The tender hearts of celery well chilled and filled with creamed cheese makes a tasty accompaniment to a lettuce salad.

Sautéed Egg Sandwiches.—Finely chop four hard-cooked eggs, then pound them to a paste with two tablespoons of butter, adding gradually two tablespoons of cream; stir until well blended and of the right consistency to spread; add more cream if needed. Season with salt, pepper, and a few grains of cayenne. Have ready, twelve thin slices of white bread, spread six slices generously with the mixture, cover with the remaining slices, press firmly together, and dip each sandwich into egg and milk beaten together, allowing two tablespoons of milk for each egg. Sauté in an equal measure of lard and butter, browning well on both sides. Serve hot at once.

College Pudding.—Mix one-half cupful of butter with one and one-half cupfuls of sugar, add four eggs well beaten, one-half cupful of strained applesauce, a fourth of a teaspoonful of salt, and the juice of a lemon. Line a pudding dish with plain pastry, fill with the mixture, and chill. Serve with or without cream.

Sponge Pudding.—Stir one cupful of flour into a cupful of milk until smooth. Set in boiling water and cook. Cool and add the yolks of three beaten eggs, a teaspoonful of melted butter, with one-fourth of a cupful of sugar. Cut and fold in the whites of the eggs, beaten stiff. Bake in a well buttered baking dish set into hot water. Bake until puffed and the eggs well set. Serve with the following sauce: Cream four tablespoons of butter and add one-half cupful of sugar and

a teaspoonful of boiling water; flavor with nutmeg or vanilla; chill before serving. (Copyright, 1927)


