America will join in what will be a great international conclave of musical good-fellowship.

The conductors of the season are Bruno Walter, Pietro Cimini, Vladimir Shavitch, Pierre Monteux, Modest Altschuler, Ossip Gabrilowitsch, Alfred Tandler, Eugene Goossens, and Alfred Hertz.

Alfred Hertz will conduct the opening and closing weeks of this season. Hertz is especially well known in Southern California for his many appearances at the bowl during the past five years. Because of his early pioneer efforts he is affectionately known as "father of the bowl."

Oiga Steeb, of whom Los Angeles is so proud because of her outstanding successes abroad and in America, will be the first soloist. She appears on Friday, July 8, and will play the beautiful Schumann concerto in A minor for the piano and orchestra.

Bruno Walter, eminent director of the Philharmonic Orchestra and the Municipal Opera of Berlin, will conduct a popular program on Saturday, July 9. In addition to his great success abroad, Walter also is well known in America for his two seasons as guest conductor with the New York Symphony Orchestra. Due to the early sailing of his steamer for Europe, Walter is trading Saturday night concerts for the "spang" concert on the second Saturday.

The price of bowl tickets is the same this year as last—\$10 for a 40-ticket book, making each admission only 25 cents. Individual tickets bought at the gate are 50 cents each. Ticket books may be obtained by mail from the Hollywood Bowl Association, 7046 Hollywood boulevard, Hollywood.

#### ORDINANCE No. 153

An Ordinance of the City of Torrance Amending Ordinance No. 53.

The Board of Trustees of the City of Torrance do ordain as follows:

SECTION 1. Section 7 of Ordinance No. 53 is hereby amended to read as follows:

SECTION 7. (a) Before any person can engage in the business of installation of electrical work in or on any building or structure in the City of Torrance, he must procure the license or permit from the said City, or from the license ordinance of the City of Torrance, or the fee for such a permit hereinafter imposed.

(b) Any person regularly licensed or holding a permit as herein provided who shall lead his license or permit to any other person or shall take out any permit and allow any other person not regularly licensed to do any electrical work under said permit, shall in addition to, and, irrespective of any other penalties imposed, have his license revoked and registration cancelled by the Board of Trustees of the City of Torrance.

(c) Every applicant for license before being granted the same must produce a certificate of having made acceptable installations in some other municipality, or a master electrician's certificate.

The City Clerk shall issue a permit to any journeyman electrician, or master electrician upon payment of \$1.00, which permit shall authorize such person to do electrical work in the City of Torrance thereafter as a journeyman electrician. No such permit to do electrical work shall be issued until the applicant therefor shall present a certificate of having performed acceptable electrical installations in some other municipality, or a master electrician's certificate, or a journeyman electrician's certificate.

SECTION 2. The City Clerk is hereby directed to certify to the adoption of this ordinance, and cause the same to be published once in the Torrance Herald, a weekly newspaper of general circulation printed and published in the City of Torrance, and thereupon and thereafter the same shall be in full force and effect.

#### ORDINANCE No. 154

An Ordinance Amending Ordinance No. 107.

The Board of Trustees of the City of Torrance do ordain as follows:

SECTION 1. Section No. 27 of Ordinance No. 107 is hereby amended to read as follows: "SECTION 27. It shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation as owner, architect, contractor or otherwise, to erect or cause to be erected or to commence or proceed with the erection of any building within the limits of fire district number One or number One-A of the City of Torrance, unless said building shall conform in all respects to the requirements of

this ordinance for a building of either classes A, B or C, as the same are hereinabove more particularly set forth, or to construct a building of either of said classes of a height greater than is hereinafter set forth as the limit of such height, except that galvanized iron construction may be used for industries in the industrial district.

SECTION 2. The City Clerk shall certify to the adoption of this ordinance and cause the same to be published once in the Torrance Herald, a weekly newspaper, printed and published in the City of Torrance, and thereupon and thereafter the same shall be in full force and effect.

#### ORDINANCE No. 155

An Ordinance of the City of Torrance Amending Ordinance Number 51.

The Board of Trustees of the City of Torrance do ordain as follows:

SECTION 1. Section No. 11 of Ordinance No. 51, is hereby amended by adding thereto the following provision: The set-back line on both sides of El Dorado, Sonoma and Sierra Streets, from Cedar Street to Main Avenue, in the City of Torrance, is hereby established at three feet from the line of said El Dorado, Sonoma and Sierra Streets, so that buildings which may lawfully be built on such streets may be built not closer than three feet from the boundary line of said streets.

SECTION 2. The City Clerk shall certify to the adoption of this ordinance and cause the same to be published once in the Torrance Herald, a weekly newspaper printed and published in the City of Torrance, and thereupon and thereafter the same shall be in full force and effect.
